# **ART. 1 GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### ART. 1.1 OBJECTIVES

Erasmus+ Individual mobility for learning purposes is governed by Erasmus+ 2021/2027 (Regulation (EU) 2021/817 of the European Parliament and of the Council and Erasmus+ Programme Guide 2021-2027). Through lifelong learning, the Programme supports the educational, professional and personal development of young people and encourages sustainable growth, employment, innovation, social cohesion, the strenghtening of the European Identity and active citizenship.

Erasmus+ Programme allows the participation of the extra UE Countries as well, defined Partner Countries. European Countries traditionally included in the Program are defined Programme Countries. In both cases, the student in Erasmus mobility, receives financial contributions and has the possibility:

- to follow the courses and to take exams;
- to combine a study period with one of traineeship or one of thesis research
- to conduct research under the related PhD

The recognition in career of the activities undertaken abroad (with a positive outcome), if they are previously approved through the Learning Agreement / Change Form, is guaranteed by Sapienza with the approval of the Erasmus Policy Statement (EPS) and the <u>Student Mobility Regulations and the recognition of a period of study and training abroad.</u>

## ART. 1.2 MOBILITY TOWARDS CIVIS ALLIANCE UNIVERSITIES

Sapienza is a partner of the "CIVIS - A European Civic University" Alliance financed by the European Union, which is formed with:

- Free University of Brussels
- University of Tübingen,
- Autonomous University of Madrid, (not available for CORIS students)
- Aix-Marseille Universitè, (not available for CORIS students)
- University of Bucharest,
- · University of Stockholms,
- Ethniko Kai Kapodistriako Panestimio Athinon
- <u>University of Glasgow</u>, Associated University, (not available for CORIS students)

Students who will participate in the mobility towards one of the CIVIS Universities, will join an European community, which will benefit from enhanced services and new innovative educational paths.

# **ART.1.3 PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES**

It will be possible to participate in the Eramus+ Programme for studying in the Universities which concluded an interistituional agreement with Sapienza and are presented in one of the following groups:

- **Programme Countries** wihch include: Member States of the European Union, Countries of the European Economis Area (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway) and Candidate Countries for Eumembership (Turckey, Serbia and Republic of North Macedonia);
- Partner Countries: United Kingdom and Switzerland.

# **ART. 2 REQUIREMENTS**

#### ART, 2.1 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. In order to apply to this call, students must be **enrolled in Sapienza** for the **2021/2022 Academic Year** in a Bachelor, Master, or PhD degree programme.





- 2. Students must have adequate language skills (see art. 2.4 "LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS").
- 3. Students must complete **their enrolment at Sapienza University for Academic Year 2022/2023 by the established deadlines** (further information: <a href="https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina-strutturale/studenti">https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina-strutturale/studenti</a> section "University Tuition"), except for undergraduates, pursuant to art. 13 of the study regulations.
- 4."application for the following study cycle": students who in the academic year 2021/2022 are enrolled in a degree course, the third year or out of course (first cycle), and who plan to graduate during the academic year 2021/2022, they can start during the first year of a Master's Degree Course (second cycle) as long as the latter relates to this announcement. Mobility can only be carried out in the second semester of the academic year 2022/2023. If the student applies for a one-year mobility, the same will be reduced by the office upon authorization from the partner University. To take advantage of the mobility, students must enroll in a Master's Degree Course for the academic year 2022/2023, provided by the Department of Communication and Social Research. If the application concerns mobility in the study areas 032 and 0321, in case ofenrollment in the Master's Degree Course "Development Sciences and International Cooperation", it will not be possible to take advantage of the mobility won. The application must concern destinations in which the master's level (2) is included, except for those in Spain which offer a single cycle of studies, called GRADO or GRAU, and identified as level 1. In no case will it be allowed to anticipate the departure in the first semester.
- 5. Students on an Erasmus mobility period may not graduate before the end of their period of study abroad and before the recognition of the academic activities conducted abroad and planned in the Learning Agreement/Change Form, through the digitized validation procedure, otherwise they will have to give back the financial contributions (see Art.9 Learning Agreement).
- 6. **Students enrolled in PhD Programmes** must end their mobility period before the official end of the Doctoral Programme and they must in any case obtain a certificate of the activity carried out by the host University.

# ART. 2.2 INCOMPATIBILITY

Students who apply for this call can go on an Erasmus+ mobility up to a maximum total of 12 months for each study cycle (Bchelor, Master or PhD), even if undertaken in other University. Any Erasmus mobility period undertaken online from the residence Country, won't be counted.

Every candidate has the responsibility to verify the number of monthly amount resuidual for the study cycle which they are enrolled in and request the eventual reduction of the duration of the mobility.

Otherwise, the mobility can be cancelled and contributions already given must be returned.

In this regars, please note that, as per Art. 76 - D.P.R. 28.12.2000 N. 445 "... whoever provides false declarations, false acts or uses them for the purposes of the present call is passable of punishment as established by legislation and all special bills in this matter."

The abovementioned norm can be applied to any declaration or document released by the candidate in this selective procedure

Prior mobility periods that have already been funded during the same study cycle under ICM (International Credit Mobility), Lifelong Learning Programme, Erasmus+, Erasmus Mundus Action 1 and Erasmus Mundus Action 2 are included in the calculation of the total number of months spent abroad.

### ART, 2.3 ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- 1. In order to participate to the selection procedure it is sufficient to have acquired at least 6 CFU and registered on Infostud.
- 2. During the selection process, all credits acquired until the application submission, obtained exclusively through exams and **officially registered on Infostud**, will be accepted and considered for the selection process. Nevertheless, students may self-certify on their online application form, exams they have taken but not yet registered on Infostud, at the closing of the call. Self-certified exams will be checked.





Only the exams included in the study programme in which the student is enrolled can be self-certified. Therefore, it is forbidden to self-certify:

- Exams taken during a previous cycle of studies (Bachelor) for students enrolled in a Master programme
- Single courses
- Extracurricular exams ex art. 6 of RD n. 1269/38.

In case of false and mistaken self-certifications, a 100 points penalty will be applied on the academic merit score.

#### ART, 2.4 LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

**Students applying** to the Call must have a minimum <u>A2 language level</u> (Common European Framework of Reference recognized by the Council of Europe <a href="https://www.coe.int/en/web/common-european-framework-reference-languages">https://www.coe.int/en/web/common-european-framework-reference-languages</a>

The language skill is alternatively verified:

- With a positive test, taken in November 2021 or January February 2022 at the University Language Centre (Centro Linguistico di Ateneo) before concluding the online application;
- With the test passed during the application for the ERASMUS + 2021/2022 call. Students who do
  not intend to take advantage of this exemption, can take the test again at the CLA. In this case, the
  new result obtained (lower, higher or failed test for the language in which the test is repeated) will
  replace the previous one:
- With the possession of one of the requirements indicated in the art.2.4.3 (Exemption from language tests")

The evaluation of linguistic competence, in addition to being a requirement for access to the selection, constitutes an element of evaluation for the ranking (Article 8.1). The lack of an assessment of linguistic competence leads to the impossibility of assigning the relative score and consequently, the exclusion from the entire selection procedure.

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> the CLA test or the exemption according to the art. 2.4.3 does not exempt students from respecting the language requirements of the host University, which must be met to enjoy the selected mobility period. If the host University requires a specific language certificate, the student must possess it before the departure (during the application at last). Therefore, in case of equal score, the chosen destination will be assigned to the student who has already uploaded the required language certificate in the application.

# ART. 2.4.1 LANGUAGE TESTS

The tests, for the vehicular languages only, FRENCH, ENGLISH, PORTUGUESE, SPANISH, GERMAN, will be provided by the CLA, in presence, and the student must present a valid identification document: identity card, passport, driving license ( SEE ANNEX 2 INFORMATION FOR ACCESS TO TESTS)

Students who have not already taken tests in the November 2021 or January 2022 sessions, have to book them by choosing date and time from the options in the form available in the online application, according to the following calendar:

- From 14th to 18th February 2022, with two shifts at 10 and 14 respectively;
- From 21 to 22 February 2022, with two shifts at 10 and 14 respectively.

## PLEASE NOTE: only dates and time/turns still available will be visible in the form

The reservation of test is confirmed only after receiveng the notification on the istitutional mail. The student can take the test for a maximum of two languages on the basis of the destination he/she intends to choose in the application, necessarily on the same day, turn and time. It will be possible to take only one test for each language.

The linguistic certification tests are multistage ( with threshold) and include





- Multiple choice questions
- Close mode questions
- Drag and drop texts

The test principally covers grammatical knowledge and text comprehension. There won't be speaking and listening sessions. It starts from level A2 and, based on the score obtained, you can move on to the next levels (step by step) up to level C1. The test will last a maximum of 60 minutes (if all four levels have been completed) and no online test simulations will be available.

## PLEASE NOTE: there will be no retake sessions.

For those who have already taken tests in the November 2021 or January 2022 sessions, it will not be possible to repeat tests for the same languages.

In each day, there is a maximum of 340 students (170 per turn) and the reservation is possibile until all seats are taken. Therefore, it is highly recommended to proceed promptely to the test reservation to have the highest possibility of choice.

The result of the test (s) of February 2022 will be published on Moodle but will be transferred to the application only if the student opens the form by connecting to this link: <a href="https://relint.uniroma1.it/candidatura/login.aspx">https://relint.uniroma1.it/candidatura/login.aspx</a>

These results will be visible in the application by 25.02.2022.

Students who have already taken the test at the CLA in November 2021 and January 2022 are invited to access the <u>application form</u> to allow the acquisition of the test result by 15/02/2022.

The certification of the linguistic certification test result will be released only to who will join the Eramus+ mobility. This certification, which is not a proper linguistic certification, will be available for downloading in your personal Erasmus page.

# ART. 2.4.2 INFORMATION FOR DISABLED STUDENTS AND SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH LEARNING DISORDERS

Students with disabilities (as per Art. 3 of Bill N. 104/1992) and/or disabilities equal or greater to 66% won't have to take necessarly the computer-delivered language test, by reporting their disabled condition in the reservation form. The CLA will assess the knowledge of the language according to the most suitable procedures for the student needs.

Students with learning disorders (as per Bill N. 170/2010 and DM N. 5669/2011) who require specific aides to complete the test, must indicate this on their language test booking form. Candidates with learning disorders will be given 30% additional time; particular situations will be examined on the basis of the provided certifications.

All requests must be submitted by the language test registration deadline (see Art.2.4.1. "LANGUAGE TESTS") and will be verified by the Office for Students with Disabilities and Learning Disorders, which may request official certifications from the National Health Service or accredited specialists and facilities.

Learning disorder certification must refer to official reading/writing/calculation levels. Diagnoses must be updated after 3 years, if it was issued to a minor.

**PLEASE NOTE:** students with disabilities or learning disorders, who are resident abroad and intend to enjoy the measures described above, must submit certifications issued in their country of residence together with a sworn translation into Italian or English.

#### ART. 2.4.3 EXEMPTION FROM LANGUAGE TESTS

Only students who meet one of the following requirements are exempt from taking the language assessment test at the CLA, without prejudice to the minimum requirement required by the host institutions:





- 1. Have passed the test for the Erasmus+ 2021/2022 call according to the art. 2.4
- 2. Being a native speaker for the language chosen for the mobility; according to the directives issued by the Ministry of Public Education with circular letter no. 5494 of 12/29/1982 (ref. CUN of 10/30/1982), the quality of native speker is recognized "to Italian and foreign citizens only when it is proven that they have completed at least the entire cycle of elementary education and secondary school in the country of which they intend to spek the language, in state or private (recognized) schools of the same nationality ". Students who intend to make use of this exemption must provide a copy of the Diploma they have obtained or other suitable documentation to prove that they fall within the specific case. The mother tongue corresponds to level C2 of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR).
- 3. Having achieved a minimum level of linguistic competence equal to level A2, certified by an official certificate for at least one of the languages indicated in art. 2.4.1 "LANGUAGE TEST" issued by one of the Certifying Bodies provided for in the CEFR equivalence table, referred to in Annex 1, for the language (s) chosen for mobility purposes. Document to upload in the application form: language certificate.
- 4. Be enrolled in a Sapienza degree programme that is held entirely in English, in case that English is one of the languages required for the mobility purposes. Students in this condition are automatically assigned the B2 level for the English language. For students of the Department of Communication and Social Research, this exemption applies to students enrolled in the English curriculum "Economics for Develpment"
- 5. Having obtained the upper secondary school diploma from an international high school recognized by the MUR for at least one of the languages English, French (ESABAC diploma), German, Spanish or Portuguese (the upper secondary school diploma at an international high school corresponds to level B2). Document to upload in the application form: diploma.
- 6. Having obtained, during the mobility period carried out in the academic year 2020/2021 and 2021/2022, a minimum level of linguistic competence equal to level A2 for one of the languages indicated in art. 2.4.1 "LINGUISTIC TEST" by means of a certificate of linguistic competence level issued by the Language Center of the host University. Document to upload in the application form: language certificate.
- 7. Beeing bilingual, if the second language is the one chosen for mobility. The status of a bilingual is recognized to those who have completed at least the entire cycle of elementary and secondary education in the Regions with a special status or in the Autonomous Provinces where bilingualism is in force according to the current Regional Statute. Students who intend to make use of this exemption will be able to declare it with a self-certification pursuant to Presidential Decree 445/2000, to be uploaded in the application form. Students who are in this condition are automatically assigned level C1.

## **PLEASE NOTE:**

- In case the student wants to apply for a University which requires a higher linguistic competence than the cases abovementioned, he/she will have to take the CLA test.
- The exempations from the linguistic test are valid ONLY if the language which the student asks for be exempted from, is suitable for studying at the chosen University. Otherwise it is mandatory to take the test at the CLA:
- Documents for the exemption from the linguistic assessement test must be uploaded on the online appplication form;





- Documents for the exemption from the language assessment test are evaluated by the Commission to verify its validity / suitability. The negative outcome of the evaluation involves the exclusion from the ranking for the chosen University or from the entire selection procedure, if it involves the lack of an assessment of linguistic competence (ART. 2.4 LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS);
- Language tests taken as part of a degree programme do not exempt you from the CLA Test. Similarly, declarations issued by professors, even university professors, and language exams will not be considered valid.

#### ART, 2.5 OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- This call is reserved for students enrolled in Degree/Doctorate Courses provided by the Department of Communication and Social Research.
- This call is not open to students enrolled in other Faculties/ Departments.
- This Call is open to students enrolled in the PhD course in Research, Communication, Social Research and Marketing.
- Students who intend to carry out research for the degree thesis must obtain the approval of the Italian supervisor and obtain credit recognition before graduating. Moreover, it is recommended to verify the willingness of the partner University chosen to host students intending to undertakes exclusively activity of research for the thesis without taking exams, since some Universities require the insertion of a minum of credits for exam.

# **ART. 3 DURATION**

The period of the mobility is defined by the interistitutional agreement between Sapienza and the other University partners.

The mobility can start from the 1<sup>st</sup> June 2022 and it must conclude before the 30<sup>th</sup> September 2023. It must be undertaken continuously.

There are two types of mobility:

- 1. LONG MOBILITY for I, II and III study cycle: it can be undertaken by all the students in a I, II and III study cycle at University partners. (Programme Countries e Partner Countries, see art. 1.3). Every Long Mobility can last a minimum of two months (60 days) and a maximum of 12. It can be modified only for proven academic reasons in which the student:
  - Starts the mobility in the second semester
  - Has already benefited from mobility period in the same study cycle (see art. 2.2). in this
    case, the maximus duration will be reduced with prior authorization of the University of
    destination.
- 2. SHORT MOBILITY only for PhD students: it can be undertaken only by students enrolled in Phd and it can last a minum of 5 days and a maximum of 30 days, only at Programme Countries. It has always to be authorized in advanced by the Host University (see art 7.3 Short Mobility Application for PhD students.
- 3. Before the start of the mobility, the <u>Faculty Erasmus office</u> acquires formal confirmation of the "Short mobility" from the host University. If authorization is denied, the PhD student is invited to accept the "LONG MOBILITY" mobility. The refusal is considered as a waiver of the mobility won and the seat is assigned to the first candidate in a useful position in the ranking, in the form of long mobility.

#### **ART. 4 GRANTS**

**The definition of the contributions** will be influenced by the approval of the convention with Erasmus + Indire National Agency and the University Board of Directors.

The contributions to the mobility are exclusively assigned for academic activities abroad with the partner Universities (see art. 6 "Educational activitiy abroad") In order to benefit from the Erasmsu contrbutions, **strictly before departure**, the student assigned to the mobility must accept the terms of the financial contract and follow the instructions that will be provided at the time of the assignment of the mobility itself.





# ART. 4.1 EUROPEAN UNION GRANT

The <u>grants</u> are to be considered as a contribution to the higher expenses related to the stay abroad. The use of the community contribution is incompatible with further grants deriving from other programs / actions funded by the European Union.

The amount of the contribut varies depending on:

- 1. Typology of mobility
- 2. Country of destination

The UE contributio destined for the Long mobility is compared to the life cost of the country of destionation and the number of attending days certified by the partner University.

# PLEASE NOTE:

Mobilities towards Switzerland will not receive UE contribution if directly funded by the Swiss government.

Ue contribution destined or the short mobility (only Programme Countries), provided only for PhD students, will be paid on the basis of a daily amount.

In case of exhaustion of EU funds or if the student benefits from the simultaneous allocation of other university or EU funding, it will be possible to assign the student the status of "Erasmus zero eu-grant" which allows them to benefit from the facilities related to mobility, without gaining the community contribution.

# ART. 4.2 ADDITIONAL MUR AND SAPIENZA GRANT FOR STUDENTS WITH DISADVANTAGED BACKGROUNDS

In addition to the Eu contribution, the beneficiaries of the mobility can receive more integrative contributions from Sapienza and the Ministery fro the University and the Research (MUR). The allocation of the MUR





contribution will be assigne on the basis of the economic condition of the student who is obliged to prove it through ISEE 2022 (ISEE for the right to university study DPCM 159/2013). The information must be available on Infostud before the 30<sup>th</sup> November of 2022 or anyway before the acceptance of the terms of the financial Contract, otherwise the MUR grant cannot be given.

## **IMPORTANT:**

- All the students or PhD students who in any capacity are exempted from submitting ISEE for the purpose of paying taxes, in order to benefit from the supplementary MUR contribution, must still apply for the Isee 2022.
- The MUR and Sapienza contributions will not be paid to students who are enrolled in years subsequent to the first out of course (for the calculation, reference will be made to the year of enrollment at Sapienza, even in the case of transfer of the course).

The students who will have not obtained the recognition of at least 6 CFU through the relative procedure by 31/12/2022, will be required to return the total of the aforementioned contribution. In case of students who undertook exclusively activity of research for the thesis, the credits required are reduced to 3. The recognition in career must be completed following the digitized procedure through the personal Erasmus page which includes the validation from the Academic supervisor (see Art.9). The limits above do not count for the PhDstudents.

# ART. 4.3 ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR DISABLED STUDENTS AND/OR STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

- 1. In order to allow a wider student participation in the mobility programme, Indire the National Agency for Erasmus+ allocates grants intended to support disabled students and/or students with special needs.
- 2. Interested students must communicate their disability/special need both through their application form and upon acceptance, if assigned to a mobility period.
- 3. the students who want to benefit form the contribution for special need will receive information about the modalities of request as soon as the National Erasmus+ Agency INDIRE will give details (see website: <a href="http://www.uniroma1.it/erasmus/studenti-students/erasmus-studenti-diversamente-abili">http://www.uniroma1.it/erasmus/studenti-students/erasmus-studenti-diversamente-abili</a>)
- 4. the funding of the contribution for special needs is subordinated to the allocation of the funds of the National Erasmus+ Agency INDIRE. In case the financial cover will not be totally or in part available, the student must bear the cost autonomously.

#### ART. 4.4 TAXATION OF THE ERASMUS + GRANT

Under Article 1, paragraph 50, Law No 208 - 28.12.2015, grants for international mobility are subjected to the exemptions provided by Article 1, paragraph 3, Decree-Law N. 105 - 9 May 2003, converted with amendments into Law N. 170 - 11 July 2003, except further amendments.

# **ART. 5 DESTINATIONS AND PLACES AVAILABLE**

- 1. Students can apply for a maximum of 2 destinations.
- 2. The order of priority indicated in the application is binding for the purposes of the location assignment.
- 3. When choosing the destination, it is essential to pay attention to the language level required to be able to attend the lessons and take the exams (see art. 2.4 "LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS"), to the level of study (1,2,3), and to the area of study. Particular attention must be paid in the hypothesis of "starting in the next study cycle" (see Article 2.1, point no. 4).

## **PLESE NOTE:**

 Regarding the choice of locations, the student must take into consideration the possibility of being tested on a maximum of two languages apart from benefitting of possible exemptions. (see art. 2.4.3 "





- it is necessary to look at the linguistic level required by the University to be able of attending classes and taking exams.
- the language requirements indicated in the table "destinations and available places" are established by the partner universities and may be updated without notice. Therefore, applicants are recommended to personally verify these requirements. The languages indicated by the partner are considered alternatives: it is not necessary to have skills in several languages to attend a University:
- The candidate must verify the consistency of the academic offer in the language study chosen;
- The candidate must verify the compatibility of the academic offer of the foreign Faculty/Department/ School of reference, with the study path;

#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

- If the exchange concerns the study level 3 as well, 1 place is reserved for the candidate enrolled in a PhD course. In case of candidacy of 2 or more enrolled in a PhD course, the reserved place is assigned to the one with the highest score. If no application is submitted by PhD students, the reserved place is available for students enrolled in degree courses (levels 1 and 2), if included in the exchange agreement.
- Available places and destinations are subjected to modifications if the partner universities or national and European organisations regulating the programme introduce variations. Before applying, please independently verify the feasibility of studying at your preferred destinations on the websites of the universities.
- At the moment of publication of the call, the agreements have not already been officially signed, since, as indicated in the new Erasmus+ programme 2021-2027, the agreements must be signed digitally through the network Erasmus Without Papers, still in phase of technical implementation. Therefore, it is possible that some conditions may modify during the final conclusion of the agreement and that not all the students selected may effectively join the mobility and do it in the present conditions. It will be up to Erasmus offices to make sure that this phase will not influence the condition of the students, but it is still important for the students to be aware that all the available destinations, as they have been published, are under condition.
- It will not be possible to guarantee the beginning of a mobility period in the 1st semester for destinations that have a deadline (for the submission of student documents) not compatible with the schedule of this call (Art. 14 "END OF PROCEDURE"). In this case, the mobility is postponed, upon notice from the Erasmus Office, to the 2nd semester. If the candidate is not interested in postponing the departure, is considered to have renounced, has no right to be assigned to another destination and the destination is assigned to the first candidate in a useful position in the ranking.

## **ART. 6 ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES ABROAD**

Students must indicate the didactic activities they intend to pursue abroad on the application form. In particular, it is necessary to clearly indicate in the "motivation" section of the application form, the STUDY PROJECT (see article 8), which is being evaluated.

The indicated activities are not final and may be integrated upon completion of the official Learning agreement (Art. 9 "LEARNING AGREEMENT") that will have to be approved by the Degree Programme Academic Mobility Coordinator (RAM).

Admissible mobility activities are:

- Attendance of courses and passing of the relative exams
- Preparation of the degree thesis and/or doctoral thesis
- Curricular traineeship (only if planned by the study path and if carried out within the host university).

**PhD students,** after having verified their eligibility for a mobility period abroad, must agree on the educational programme abroad with the Coordinator of the PhD Programme in which they are enrolled.





Moreover, they will have to ascertain their insurance coverage with the relevant offices (https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina/polizze-assicurative-studenti).

#### **ART. 7.1 DEADLINES AND SUBMISSION**

- 1. The deadline for submission of the on-line application form is on the 4 March 2022 2.00 pm (Italian time).

3. In order to submit your candidation, it is mandatory to use the university e-mail account (cognome.matricola@studenti.uniroma1.it). This will be the only official means used for communications for this call and subsequent procedures, both with La Sapienza and with the host University.

Once the application has been completed, the student will riceive a report of all data inserted as only certificate of the correct submission of the very application. Therefore, it is up to every candidate to verify the receipt of the report, to check that data are correct and in case to communicate promptely possible mistakes to the Faculty Erasmus Administrative Coordinator - Fabrizio Di Lullo erasmuscomunicazione@uniroma1.it

# ART. 7.2 DOCUMENTS TO SUBMIT

In order to correctlycomplete the application process, students must fill out all fields of the on-line form and verify the upload of the following documents, which are an integral part of the application:

- 1. Scan of a valid identity document (mandatory).
- 2. **Any documentation for exemption from language tests** (only in the case referred in the art. 2.4.3 "Exemption from language test")

**PLEASE NOTE:** Failure to upload the mandatory documents, as well as the lack of truthfulness of the self-certified information, involves exclusion from the selection procedure.

# ART. 7.3 "SHORT MOBILITY" APPLICATION FOR STUDENTS

PhD students who intend to apply for the destination available for their level (3) and who want to undertake an Erasmus+ SHORT MOBILITY, are required to delare it in the process of application by putting a "flag" in the appropriate field near the chosen University. If the student will not declare the intention of undertaking a short mobility in the application, the mobility will be considered as long mobility and it must respect the expected requirements (see Art. 3 DURATION)

# **ART. 8 RANKING**

# ART. 8.1 RANKING PROCESS

A Commission – composed of TAB and teaching staff, and elected by the Head of the Faculty – evaluates the applications.

1. Separated rankings are prepared: one is made for the CIVIS destinations and the other one for the Eramus+ destiantions.





2. In case of the same score, the students who have never benefitted from an Erasmus+ mobility before, will have the priority.

The selcetion will be done by titles, according to the evaluation criteria and scores described in this call, formalized by the Commision in the minutes and defined in full coherence with the elements object of evaluation.

#### **ELEMENTS OF EVALUATION:**

 Academic Merit: 0 – 2000 points (criterion applied only to students enrolled in a Bachelor or Master).

Academic Merit is calculated with the following formula:

number of ECTS acquired / year of studies x the weighted average of the marks.

In case of departure in the followinf cycle, the academic merits is still calculated in the basis of the current Bachelor Career.

For students enrolled in a Master Degree Course, the 180 credits of the Bachelor career are added to the credits acquired.

For students enrolled in a Master degree program, the year of the course is determined by adding the 3 years of the Bachelor career to the year of enrollment (I or II): if enrolled in the first year, the year of the course is 4; if enrolled in the second year, the course year is 5.

For out-of-course students enrolled in a Master Degree program, the years out-of-course are added to the year of the course determined as indicated above (e.g. if 1 year out of course, 5 + 1 = 6).

For out-of-course students enrolled in a Bachelor Degree program, the year of the course is determined by adding the years out of course to the natural duration of the career (e.g. if 1 year out of course, 3 + 1 = 4).

For students enrolled in a Master Degree program, the weighted average of the Bachelor career is also taken into account to determine the weighted average of the marks. The weighted average of the Bachelor career is obtained from the Bachelor graduation mark, according to the following calculation:  $31 \times 11$  Bachelor graduation mark / 111. The result is added to the weighted average of the Master degree career and then divided by 2.

For students of a Master Degree program, who have obtained a three-year degree abroad, the Bachelor graduation mark on a flat-rate basis is 88/110 (arithmetic average rounded down, between minimum and maximum degree mark in Italy).

The average 30 with honors is calculated as 31;the graduation mark 110 with honors is calculated as 111.

**PLEASE NOTE:** They are not taken into consideration in the calculation of the weighted average and of the acquired credits:

- Exams taken abroad during Erasmus periods that have not been officialised with the validation procedure yet.
- Extracurricular exams (former Art. 6 Regio Decreto N. 1269/38) as they do not count for CFUs necessary for obtaining the degree.
- integrated exam and ADE (esami integrati e ADE (attività didattiche elettive: elective didactic activities) if the credits concerning all the parts constituing the integrated exam have not been passed.
- Exams for single courses that have not been recognised as part of the degree programme (Bachelors, Masters, one Cycle) for which the student is currently enrolled.
- Cancelled exams due to lack of prerequirements.





- Exams declared to have been taken, but which were only booked and/ or not taken.

# 2. Linguistic competence: 0 - 2000 points.

The linguistic competence is evalueted according to what is indicated in the art. 2.4, with the following scores: A2= 50 points; B1=500 points; B2=1000 points; C1=1500 points; C2=2000 points.

If the requirements for a destination include different languages and the candidate is competent in them, the score will be given for the principal one spoken in the destination Country.

In case of different titles for the same language, the Commision will take into consideration the one with the higher score.

# 3. Study project: da 0 a 2000 points.

The study project must not be confused with the Learning Agreement, which is the actual study contract that binds formally the student who benefits from the mobility, La Sapienza and the host (see art. 9).

## For candidates enrolled in a Bachelor or Master Degree Programme:

The study project is a list of exams the student would like to take in each chosen destination.

In the section of the online application called "motivation", it is possible to insert free text for each destination chosen. In this section, **only** the list of foreign exams must be entered with a clear indication of the correspondence with each Italian exam for which recognition is to be obtained. The exams, both foreign and Italian, must be listed with an epigraph (name of the exam) and ECTS / CFU. The epigraph of the foreign exams must be indicated in the same language that is intended to be used in the chosen location and that is evaluated through the CLA test or exemption (Article 2.4).

The online application form contains a special section in which to list the foreign exams that you intend to take at each chosen location. This section does not allow to indicate the correspondences with the Italian exams. This section **must also** be completed.

The study project is evaluated by RAM Prof. Giovanna Gianturco. The evaluation is comparative. The score is assigned on the basis of the quality, congruity and consistency of the proposed project. The score for the study project is therefore not attributed exclusively on the basis of the number of credits that make it up. Each CFU is worth 66.66 points. The resulting score is rounded up or down. The foreign exams indicated in the study project must all take place in the same semester of mobility. The number of CFU / ECTS indicated in the study project must correspond to that subsequently entered in the L.A.: minimal decreases are allowed, while for increasing variations there are no limits. However, the exams formalized in the L.A. may differ from those indicated in the study plan.

In the case of application for "departure in the next cycle", when completing the study project, it is necessary to clearly indicate in the motivation which Master's Degree Course you intend to enroll in and the correspondence between the foreign exams and the exams of the master's Degree course.

The study project left blank or filled in in a way that does not correspond to the information available in the call or the links provided, is automatically assigned a score of "0".

Students who intend to benefit from Erasmus+ mobility to accomplish the thesis research must indicate the title and the topic of the thesis and the supervisor in the study project.

**For candidates enrolled in a PhD Programme:** the study project consists only in indicating the title of the thesis and the subject of the research, in the section called "motivation". The study project is assigned a score from 0 to 2000 points, on the basis of a comparative evaluation carried out by RAM Prof. Giovanna Gianturco, regarding the quality of the planned research. A "0" score is automatically assigned to the study project left blank or filled out in a way that does not meet the indicated criteria.

In case the research project is left blank or filled in a not appropriate way according to the call indications, a score equal to "0" is automatically given.

#### ART. 8.1.1 PUBLICATION OF THE RANKINGS

The Commission will produce the **rankings** based on the above-mentioned criteria. Rankings will be published on the following links:

The rankings are provisional.

If there will be no requests of revision that might modify the rankings, they will be automatically considered final **10 days** after the publication. The requests for revision must be sent to the Departmental Erasmus Office (erasmuscomunicazione@uniroma1.it).

# Revision of the provisional ranking:

The request for revision suspends the aforementioned term of 10 days.

Revision is possible only for material or calculation errors.

The request must be preceded by an informal access according to L. 7 August 1990 n. 241.

Instances not preceded by informal access are inadmissible and not considered.

The requests are evaluated by the Commission which decides within 3 working days.

No appeals against the decision are given.

If the revision is accepted, the provisional ranking object of modification is published again with the appropriate corrections on the following links:

After the publication of the provisional ranking corrected following a revision, the residual deadline for submitting new revisions requests continues to run.

After the deadline for submitting revisions requests, the ranking becomes final.

The Administration can act in self-defense.

## Times and methods of publications.:

the documents will be published with the following names and order:

- -rankings of CIVIS destinations and Erasmus+ destinations, first and second choices;
- -list of residual destinations and list of the candidates eligible to apply;
- -eventual update of the list of residual destinations;
- rankings of residual CIVIS destinations and residual Erasmus+ destinations, first and second choices.

Within these, there will be specific rankings relatd to the single Universities, possibly differentiated by study area.





The rankings indicate:

- Universities identification code, study area, number of available places, matriculation numbers and total scores of **the winners (written in red)**;
- matriculation numbers and total scores of the eligible but non-winners ( written in black);
- matriculation numbers of excluded candidates from the ranking or from the entire selction procedure with relating motivations.

Scrollings of the ranking are not published.

In any case, the displacement of the candidates among rankings is not possible.

#### ART, 8.1.2 RESIDUAL DESTINATIONS

The residual destinations are the ones which, after the rankings of CIVIS and Erasmus+ destination – first and second choices – have not been assigned yet to any candidates.

Candidates whose application is valid and who are not winners of other destiantions, are eligible to apply for residual destinations.

Eligible candidates receive an excel form to be filled in with a maximum of n. 2 residual destinations. The order of priority is binding for the assignment. For each choice it is necessary to indicate: the Erasmus identification code of the destination, the study area (data obtained from the table "AVAILABLE SEATS AND PLACES"), and the study project (Article 8.1 point 3).

The form must be returned to the Erasmus office (<a href="mailto:erasmuscomunicazione@uniroma1.it">erasmuscomunicazione@uniroma1.it</a>) within 7 days, otherwise it will not be considered valid.

The form filled without respecting the abovementioned indications will not be considered valid.

Each candidate can send **only one** form.

The choice and assignment of residual offices takes place in compliance with the same criteria valid for the main offices.

The ranking for residual locations is drawn up by the Commission in accordance with art. 8.1.

Art. 8.1.1. applyes as far as compatible.

Destinations still available at the end of the procedure remain unassigned.

# ART. 8.2 ACCEPTANCE OF THE MOBILITY

Winners, except for any changes of the ranking, are assignee of the destinations.

The asssignee is binded to the won destination: he /she cannot be assigned to another destination.

Winners must accept the mobility within 7 days from the assignment.

The assignment is notified via system email, sent to the institutional mail account.

Missing this deadline will be considered as a silent renunciation.

The renunciation, silent or expressed after acceptance, entails the exclusion of the candidate from the entire selection procedure: you will not be entitled to the assignment of other Universities.

The final assignment of an Erasmus+ mobility requires:

- Formalization of the Learning Agreement on the personal Erasmus page and its approval by the Academic Coordinator for International Mobility (RAM);
- Finalization of the financial contract between the student and Sapienza, according to the indications that will be provided at the time of assignment of the mobility. It must be done before the start of the mobility, otherwise the student will not be authorized to benefit from the mobilization and he/she will not receive any financial/ insurance covers.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Presence in the final ranking does not automatically mean the student will enjoy the mobility period, as this depends on the background check conducted by the Faculty and especially on requirements and of the host University. In any case, the student's mobility is subject to acceptance by the foreign Institution (i.e., academic curriculum, language skills) which may require further certificates or reject the application on the basis of regulations that are not specified in the inter-institutional agreement signed with the partner University and concerning, for example, the teaching regulations.





# ART. 8.3 REFUSAL OF THE MOBILITY AND REPLACEMENT

The acceptance of the mobility is a serious commitment for the candidate. Thus, selected candidates are expected to limit refusals, after the acceptance or at the beginning of the mobility period, on account of serious and proven matters of force majeure. These motivations must be communicated by email as soon as possible to the Faculty Erasmus office so that the reserve candidate can join the mobility at his/her place. In case of refusal, the Faculty Erasmus Office proposes the mobility to the following candidate in the ranking. This one will be contacted by email and invited to reply within 2 working days. If the candidate does not reply in time or refuses it, the next candidate will be contacted. The mobility is assigned to the candidate who accepts it. The acceptance is regulated by art.8.2.

## **ART. 9 LEARNING AGREEMENT**

Mobility beneficiaries must complete the official Learning Agreement which defines the teaching activity to be carried out abroad and guarantees the recognition of credits obtained by passing the exams / thesis research abroad.

The definition and consequent approval of the L.A. they are mandatory and binding for the mobility, under penalty of exclusion from the mobility itself.

**PLEASE NOTE:** some partner offices require compulsory in the L.A. a certain number of ECTS for exams, up to a maximum of 30 per semester of mobility, and may not admit students who do not respect the fixed quota. Therefore, PhD students and graduating students who intend to carry out research for thesis are invited to independently verify the availability of the destination to host them.

The L.A. must include exams or didactic activities aimed at obtaining and recognizing a minimum of 6 CFU (3 CFU in case of mobility for thesis research only). The student who does not meet these conditions, if assignee of MUR contribution, is required to fully repay this contribution. Doctoral students are excluded from this limit.

At the end of the mobility, the student will have to start the validation procedure for the recognition of the academic or research activity carried out at the host University. The digitized procedure must be completed exclusively through the Erasmus personal page. Otherwise, the student will be required to refund the total amount of the MUR contribution.

# ART. 10 PROCEDURES AND LOGISTICS

- 1. In order to plan a study project at the host university, before submitting the application, students must consult carefully the information available on the chosen University website. These information will be binding even for the purposes of the allocation of the mobility.
- 2. In case of degree or PhD **thesis works**, students must agree on the project with their Italian supervisor and Academic Mobility Coordinator, based on the agreement with the partner professor at the host university.
- 3. At the end of their courses, Erasmus students must take the exams as planned by the host university. Academic activities will be recognized as indicated by the Faculty and the "Rules for Student Mobility and Recognition of Study Periods and Training Abroad". Credits for exams taken at host universities must be acquired respecting all the rules and regulations of their degree programme curricula.
- 4. Students must autonomously acquire information regarding housing opportunities provided by destination universities. Moreover, students are also responsible for getting information about:

Health Assistance in the host country, requesting information from their local health office, diplomatic missions or at the following link http://www.salute.gov.it/

Entrance into the host country, checking for requirements with embassies and consulates (in Italy for non-EU citizens). Laws regulating the entrance of non-EU students in countries participating in the Erasmus+





Programme are based on the nationality of these students. Students are responsible for promptly obtaining information and all the documents needed to be admitted and allowed to sojourn in the destination country from the relevant diplomatic missions.

5. The civil responsibility and accident insurance coverage that students get automatically when enrolled at Sapienza is extended with the same procedures for the entire mobility period abroad at the host university:: <a href="https://www.uniroma1.it/it/node/24654">https://www.uniroma1.it/it/node/24654</a>. It is recommended to consider the opportunity of taking out an additional assurance cover for travelling and medical fees not covered by the TEAM. It is suggested o subscribe on the MAECI site run by the "Dove siamo nel Mondo" Entity (<a href="https://www.dovesiamonelmondo.it">www.dovesiamonelmondo.it</a>), pointing out the requested info.

# **ART. 11 CHECKS**
