

Details of the assignation procedures

The following procedure, used by the committee, provides a list of simplified indications that each candidate can follow in order to identify the final grade. Remember that:

$$\text{FG (final grade)} = \text{SG (starting grade)} + \text{CG (commission grade)}$$

Calculation of SG

The starting grade SG is the result of the sum of the candidate's average exam score as provided by the Faculty, truncated to the first decimal, after adding a bonus contribution equal to: (number of exams passed with 30 cum laude) / 3, up to a maximum of 1.0 full point.

Calculation of CG

The value of CG is calculated starting from a fixed Base Value (BV) equal to 3.0 points to which the commission can add by Collegial Valuation (CV) up to a maximum of further 6.0 points, considering:

- A. Original and / or significant individual contributions
- B. overall judgement of the work performed
- C. quality and clarity of the elaborate
- D. the quality and clarity of the presentation
- E. mastery of the issue as it emerges from the presentation
- F. the completeness of the topic examined, from the state of the art to the conclusions, as it emerges from the presentation and the discussion

The maximum value of $\text{CG} = \text{BV} (=3.0) + \text{CV} (\leq 6.0)$, is equal to 9.0 points.

Points A to C are normally evaluated by the thesis supervisor and co-supervisor (if present), while points D to F are evaluated by the Commission.

For the determination of CV, the following guidelines are valid:

- I. The supervisor (together with the co-supervisor, if present) can propose to add up to a maximum of 3.0 points. The supervisor must communicate the proposal to the Committee before the candidate's dissertation.
- II. The Auditor, if present, can propose to add up to a maximum of 1.0 points. The Auditor must communicate the proposal to the Committee before the candidate's dissertation.
- III. The commission may increase the score by a maximum of a further 2.0 points, in cases of importance of the work done and merit of the student. In this case the decision must be taken unanimously. Otherwise, in all other cases the Commission may increase the score by a maximum of 1.0 points by majority decision.

Calculation of FG

The final graduation grade is determined by considering only the whole part of the sum $\text{FG} = \text{SG} + \text{CV}$, completely truncated to decimal points. For the final score of 110 with honors, an FG score equal to or superior than 113 is required, considering that the granting of honors remains a prerogative of the degree committee, necessarily assumed unanimously.
