## Programs for Exchange Students

### ■ Academic Programs

Undergraduate and graduate courses in all subjects.

(Some courses with special requirements are upon lecturers' permission.)

\*Students are required to enroll in at least one course at the host department.

### ■ Global Culture Program

Provides students with a set of balanced curricula that include both international cultures and languages. It's a series of culture-related courses that are exclusively taught in English.

\*Students are required to enroll in at least one course.

### ■ Mandarin Training Center (MTC)

Non-Mandarin-speaking students participating in Exchange are eligible to take "semester program" (group class) at MTC for up to 6 hours per week without tuition.

\*Non-compulsory. No credit.

## Mandarin Training Center (MTC)



### Semester Program

- Non-Mandarin-speaking students participating in Exchange are eligible to take “semester program” (group class) for up to 6 hours per week without tuition.
- For students who want to take courses other than “semester program” or more than 6 hours per week, a 20% discount of standard tuition will be offered.
- Records of learning hours provided (no credit)
- Non-compulsory

### Course Features

Taught by experienced teachers.

Small class of 20 students, meet twice per week.

Class levels range from beginner to intermediate.

On-line placement test.

## Related Information

Visa Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ <b>For One-Semester Exchange Student</b> Study LESS than 6 months: <u>VISITOR VISA</u>; then apply for extension within 15 days before the duration expired.</li> <li>➤ <b>For One-Academic-Year Exchange Student</b> Study MORE than 6 months: <u>RESIDENT VISA</u>; then apply Alien Resident Certificates (ARC) within 15 days after arrival.</li> </ul>
Medical Insurance	<p>All exchange students are required to purchase both overseas <b>Accidental Insurance</b> &amp; overseas <b>Medical Insurance</b>. Each kind of insurance shall worth a minimum of NT\$1,000,000 (approx. US\$33,000) valid for the entire exchange period.</p> <p>From the 7th month of the stay, students are required to join <b>National Health Insurance (NHI)</b> of Taiwan according to the laws.</p>
Living Costs in Taipei	<p>Meal: NTD100~200 per meal</p> <p>Transportation: MRT-NTD20~65, BUS-NTD15~45, TAXI-from NTD90</p> <p>Off-campus Housing: from NTD9,000 per month</p>

## Applicant Eligibility

- Full-time students nominated by NTNU's contracted Partner Institutions
- Have completed at least 1 year of university work prior to participation in exchange
