Part VIII - Present Research Activities

Brief Description

My research interests concentrate on Labour economics, Policy evaluation, Economic Demography, Health Economics and Applied economics. I explore cutting-edge microeconometric methods in order to understand how public policy intersects with labour markets, health status, migration and human capital mobility. Recently, I am interested in economic problems concerning labour protection policies and migration. Beside my recent publications in Journal of Health Economics, Labour Economics, Demography and Health Policy, below I provide my research agenda for the upcoming period:

research agenda for the upcoming period.
Selected projects:
The purpose of this project is to measure the impact of anti-vax propaganda on healthcare
costs related to vaccine-preventable diseases for the society.
A growing share of parents not only opts out from children vaccinations, but also spreads
the fake news, reinforcing the cascade of mis-information. The project reconstructs
twitter and facebook networks spreading no-vax propaganda and measure the extent of negative externalities for the society accruing from the fake news. The project, in collaboration with Matilde Giaccherini and Gabriele Rovigatti, has received an EIEF research grant.
The project, in collaboration with Comune di Roma e Aequa Roma, is aimed at analyzing the effect of activity reduction enforcements, rolled out in several Italian municipalities, imposed on slot-machine shops. The main interest of the research is to measure the impact of reduced gambling activity on tax evasion, crime and violence. The research benefits from an extremely wide, individual level data on tax compliance and criminal records of several municipalities in the area of central Lazio.
In collaboration with prof. M. Lindeboom and prof. G. Conti, the project analyzes pre-
natal policy changes introduced in Italy in the recent years, extending mandatory pre-
natal leave to new subgroups of workers within the universe of Italian private sector
workers (INPS UNIEMENS). The project leverages the employee matched
data, allowing us to analyze to what extent firm level gender culture, contractual
agreements and mass-layoff episodes mediate this effect.
Under the HORIZON2020 LONGITOOLS project, WP8 will build on the experience of
EU-FEM a dynamic microsimulation model developed by the University of Rome Tor
Vergata Centre for Economic and International Studies (CEIS) in collaboration with the
University of Southern California Schaeffer Center for Health Policy & Economics in order to access the accessible "what is" comprises
order to assess the economic impact over the life course of possible "what-if" scenarios in order to test the potential impact of alternative social and health policies, and policy
combinations, on the social and economic outcomes of ageing populations.
In collaboration with prof. Jay Bhattacharya and prof. Grant Miller from Stanford
University, I work on a project whose overarching research goal is to understand how
changes in technological evolution move the health of populations. The main tool we use
to explore this topic is a Waaler surface, which presents iso-mortality curves in body-
weight/height space. The main results of the papers are ready and at the moment, the
empirical work is concentrated on sensitivity analysis and alternative approaches to the
estimation. The paper is aimed to be sent within 12 months for review at a top general interest science journal.
