ART. 1.1 PURPOSE

Erasmus + individual mobility for learning purposes is governed by the Erasmus + 2021/2027 program (Regulation (EU) No. 2021/817 of the European Parliament and Council of 20 May 2021 and the Erasmus + Program Guide 2021-2027). Through lifelong learning, the Program promotes the educational, professional and personal development of young people and promotes sustainable growth, employment, innovation, social cohesion, strengthening of European identity and active citizenship.

The Erasmus + program also allows participation in non-EU countries, defined as Partner Countries. The European countries traditionally included in the Erasmus + program are instead defined Program Countries. In both cases, the mobile student receives financial contributions and has the possibility to:

- take courses and take exams;
- combine a study period with a curricular or research internship period for the preparation of the thesis;
- carry out research in the context of the relevant doctorate.

The recognition in career of academic and research activities supported abroad with positive results, provided that they are previously approved through the Learning Agreement / Change Form, is guaranteed by Sapienza with the approval of the Erasmus Policy Statement (EPS) and the "Regulations for student mobility and the recognition of periods of study and training abroad".

ART.1.2 PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES

It will be possible to participate in the Erasmus + Program for study at the universities with which Sapienza has entered into an interinstitutional agreement and which are located in one of the following country groups:

- Program Countries which include: the member states of the European Union, the countries of the European Economic Area (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway) and the candidate countries for EU membership (Turkey, Serbia and the Republic of North Macedonia);

Partner Countries: United Kingdom and Switzerland.

ART. 1.3 MOBILITY TOWARDS UNIVERSITY OF THE CIVIS ALLIANCE

Sapienza is a partner of the European CIVIS alliance, "A European Civic University", funded by the European Union, which is established together with the universities of:

ART. 1.4 DOUBLE DEGREE MOBILITY

Double Degree programs allow students to spend a period of study abroad by attending courses aimed at obtaining the Italian qualification and the foreign qualification of the same level. General information is available at the page: <https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina/doppia-laurea-e-titoli-congiunti>.

The conditions for participating vary according to the foreign locations, the year of enrollment / attendance, the academic requirements required and are governed by specific agreements which also indicate the duration of the mobility, the study program and the recognition of the activities. academic studies carried out at the foreign branch and the number of places available.

Students wishing to participate in a DOUBLE DEGREE program may apply for this Call for locations reserved for this program (see art.5 "AVAILABLE SEATS AND PLACES").

ART. 2 REQUIREMENTS AND METHOD FOR SUBMITTING THE APPLICATION

ART. 2.1 GENERAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

In order to apply for the Call, students must be enrolled IN PROGRESS (even part-time) at Sapienza, in the academic year 2021/2022, to a degree course, master's degree, single cycle master's degree, research doctorate or specialization school.

2. The student must have adequate language skills (see art. 2.4 "LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS").

3. The student will have to renew the enrollment at Sapienza for the academic year 2022/2023 within the deadlines set by the University (see the page <https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina-strutturale/studenti> in the "University fees" section), except for undergraduates, pursuant to art. 13 of the Study Regulations. Therefore, students who plan to graduate in the extraordinary session a.y. 2021/2022, they will not have to enroll in the academic year 2022/2023 but the mobility must be completed by the graduation. In case of failure to graduate within the extraordinary session a.y. 2021/2022, it will be necessary to formalize enrollment in the academic year 2022/2023.

4. Students who in the academic year 2021/2022 are enrolled in the third year of a degree course (first cycle) and plan to graduate in the academic year 2021/2022, they can start during the first year of a Master's Degree Course (second cycle) as long as the latter relates to this announcement. Mobility can only be carried out in the second semester of the academic year 2022/2023. If the student applies for a one-year mobility, the same will be reduced by the office upon authorization from the destination site. To take advantage of the mobility, students must enroll in a Master's Degree Course for the academic year 2022/2023; in no case will the departure be allowed to be brought forward to the first semester.

5. Graduating students on the move will be able to graduate only after the conclusion of the study period abroad and the finalization of the digitized procedure for the recognition of the teaching activity provided for by the Learning agreement / Change form (exams or thesis research activities), under penalty of return of contributions (see Art. 9 Learning Agreement).

6. Doctoral students must complete their stay abroad within, and no later than, the end of the legal duration of the doctoral course and must in any case obtain a certificate of the activity carried out by the host university.

ART. 2.2 INCOMPATIBILITY

Students who apply for the Call can carry out Erasmus + mobility for a total period that does not exceed 12 months for each cycle of studies. (three-year, master's, and doctorate) even if carried out at another university. In the case of single-cycle degree courses, the maximum number of months is 24.

Any Erasmus mobility periods carried out in virtual mode by the country of residence will not be counted for the purpose of calculating the maximum Erasmus mobility months per study cycle.

It is the responsibility of each candidate to check the number of residual Erasmus months for the course of study to which he is enrolled and to request any reduction in the duration of the mobility if not compatible. Otherwise, the mobility can be canceled and the contributions already paid must be returned. In this regard, please note that, pursuant to art. 76 of the Presidential Decree 28.12.2000 n. 445 "... anyone who issues false declarations, forms false documents or uses them in the cases provided for by this consolidated act is punished pursuant to the criminal code and special laws on the subject".

For the purposes of calculating the months already taken in the same cycle of studies, previous mobilities also carried out within the following programs are included: ICM (International Credit Mobility), Lifelong Learning Program, Erasmus +, Erasmus Mundus Action 1, Erasmus Mundus Action 2

ART. 2.3 FACULTY REQUIREMENTS

Students enrolled in the courses listed below and who have obtained, at the time of submitting the application, at least 6 ECTS, can participate in the call, as long as they are regularly enrolled IN PROGRESS.

It should be noted that all credits accrued, acquired exclusively for exams and registered on the Infostud system at the time of submitting the application, will be considered; students will be allowed to integrate any exams taken and not yet present in their career with self-certification.

This call is open to students enrolled in the following courses of the Faculty of Political Sciences, Sociology, Communication Sciences:

THREE-YEAR DEGREE COURSES:

- Administration and Organization Sciences - L-16
- Political Science and International Relations - L-36

MASTER / SPECIALIST DEGREE COURSES:

- International Relations LM-52
- Science of Administration and Public Policy LM-63
- Political Science LM-62

DOCTORAL COURSES:

- Public, comparative and international law
- Political Studies

It should be noted that all credits accrued, acquired exclusively for exams and registered on the Infostud system at the time of submitting the application, will be considered; will be allowed to student to integrate with self-certification any exams taken and not yet present in their career.

It should be noted that this announcement is not open to students enrolled in other Faculties or other Degree Courses.

The recognition of credits related to the activities carried out in Erasmus must take place before the discussion of the thesis and the conclusion of the study course attended.

Students who intend to carry out research activities for their degree thesis must indicate the research topic and obtain the approval of the Italian supervisor and the indication of the foreign co-supervisor. In addition, it is specified that they must indicate at least 1 exam to be taken abroad.

The Erasmus study stay must end before the end of the study course attended,

Erasmus + mobility for study reasons cannot be assigned to graduates carrying out post-graduate professional internships.

ART. 2.4 LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

To apply for the Call, a minimum level of linguistic competence equal to level A2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for the knowledge of languages (CEFR) recognized by the Council of Europe is required <https://www.coe.int/en/web/common-european-framework-reference-languages>

Linguistic competence must be demonstrated:

- with the test (s) passed in the February 2022 sessions at the University Language Center (CLA) before completing the online application;
- be in possession of one of the requirements indicated in Article 2.4.3 "EXEMPTION OF LANGUAGE TEST".

Students who do not intend to take advantage of the exemption can choose to take the test again. In this case, the new result obtained (lower, higher or failed test for the language in which the test is repeated) will replace the previous one.

PLEASE NOTE: the CLA test does not exempt the student from verifying and respecting the language requirements required by the destination University, which the student is required to comply with, otherwise he or she will not be able to take advantage of the mobility at this location.

ART. 2.4.1 LANGUAGE TESTS

The tests, for the vehicular languages only, FRENCH, ENGLISH, PORTUGUESE, SPANISH, GERMAN, will be carried out by the CLA, in presence, and the student must present himself with a valid identification document (identity card, passport, driving license driving).

On the day of the test, the student must show up on time at the CLA laboratories located in the Marco Polo Building on floor 0, Tiburtina 4 (former Scalo S.Lorenzo, 82).

Candidates are reminded to keep a valid identification document and the green pass (in digital or paper format) at hand.

At the entrance to the building, each candidate will be subjected to a temperature control (in order to access it must be below 37.5 °).

Please note that from 1 September 2021 access to the Sapienza offices is subject to possession of the green pass as per Legislative Decree n. 111 of 06 August 2021 (except for exceptions defined for subjects exempt by the Ministry of Health).

Students must book by choosing the date and time from the options in the form available in the application, according to the following calendar:

- from 14 to 18 February 2022, with two shifts at 10 and 14 respectively

PLEASE NOTE: Only the dates and times / shifts still available will be visible on the form.

The booking for the tests is to be considered confirmed only upon receipt of the notification e-mail on the institutional mailbox.

The student can take tests for a maximum of two languages based on the locations he intends to choose in the application, necessarily on the same day, shift and time. It will be possible to take only one test for each language.

The language level assessment tests are multistage (with passing threshold) and include questions:

- multiple choice
- with embedded response (cloze)
- drag and drop on a text

The tests focus mainly on knowledge of grammar and understanding of the text.

Speaking and listening are not provided.

The test starts from level A2 and, based on the score obtained, it will be possible to move on to the following levels (step by step) up to level C1. The test will last a maximum of 60 minutes (if all four levels are completed).

No online test simulations are available.

PLEASE NOTE: There are no recovery sessions.

For each day there is a maximum number of 340 students (170 students in turn) and the booking, for a single day, can be made subject to availability.

It is recommended to proceed promptly with the booking of the test (s), to have the maximum possibility of choice in the days still available.

The result of the test (s) will be published on Moodle and in the application form (if the student applies to the Erasmus + 2022/2023 mobility call)

The certificate relating to the result achieved in the language assessment test will be issued exclusively to those who will carry out the Erasmus mobility. This certificate, which is NOT a language certification in accordance with the law, can be downloaded directly from your personal Erasmus page

ART. 2.4.2 - INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS WITH DIFFERENT SKILLS AND SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH D.S.A.

Students with disabilities pursuant to art. 3 of the law n. 104 of 1992 and / or with a disability equal to or greater than 66% will not necessarily have to take the language assessment test using a computer-delivered test and will have to report their disability condition in the booking form. The CLA reserves the right to ascertain knowledge of the language in the manner deemed most appropriate and best suited to the needs of the student.

Students with D.S.A., as per law n.170 / 2010 and the D.M. n. 5669/2011, which in order to carry out the test require special aids in relation to the type of D.S.A., must report this when booking the language test. These candidates are allowed an additional 30% time compared to that defined for the test.

Particular situations will be examined taking into account the certifications presented.

Requests must be received by the deadline for enrollment in the language assessment test (see art. 2.4.1. "LINGUISTIC TEST") and will be subject to verification by the Disability and SLD Office which may request appropriate certification issued by structures of the SSN or by specialists and structures accredited by the same.

The certification of D.S.A. must refer to the nosographic codes and the explicit wording of the D.S.A. (of Reading and / or Writing and / or Calculation).

The diagnosis must be updated after 3 years if performed by the minor student.

PLEASE NOTE: students with disabilities or with D.S.A. resident in foreign countries, who intend to take advantage of the aforementioned measures, must present the certification certifying the status of disability or D.S.A. issued in the country of residence, accompanied by a sworn translation in Italian or English.

ART. 3 DURATION

The duration of the mobility is defined by the interinstitutional agreement stipulated between Sapienza and the partner universities.

The mobility can be started starting from 1 June 2022, it must end by 30 September 2023 and must be carried out on an ongoing basis.

Mobility can be of 2 types:

1. Erasmus LONG MOBILITY mobility for I, II and III study cycle:

It can be carried out by all those belonging to the I, II and III cycle of study at partner universities (Program Countries and Partner Countries, see art. 1.3 Participating Countries). Each long mobility must have a minimum duration of 2 months (60 days) and a maximum of 12 or 24 months in the case of a single cycle. The duration may vary only for proven academic reasons if the student:

- start mobility in the second semester,
- has already benefited from periods of mobility in the same cycle of studies (see art. 2.2.). In this case, the maximum duration will be reduced to the residual monthly salaries with respect to the maximum limit of 12 months for the cycle of studies and 24 months for single-cycle degrees, subject to authorization by the destination site.

2. Erasmus mobility SHORT MOBILITY only for PHD STUDENTS:

The short mobility can only be carried out by students enrolled in PhD courses, it must have a minimum duration of 5 days and a maximum of 30 days, and it must take place only at Program Countries. Short mobility must always be authorized in advance by the host university (see art. 7.3 "SHORT MOBILITY" APPLICATION FOR PHD STUDENTS).

ART. 4. CONTRIBUTIONS AND ECONOMIC BENEFITS

The determination of the contributions will be conditioned by the approval of the agreement with the Erasmus + Indire National Agency and the University Board of Directors.

Mobility grants are assigned exclusively for carrying out academic activities at the partner university (see art. 6 "ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES IN THE FOREIGN OFFICE"). In order to benefit from Erasmus grants the student assignee of mobility must, strictly before departure, accept the terms of the financial contract and follow the instructions that will be provided at the time of assignment of the mobility itself.

ART. 4.1 EUROPEAN UNION CONTRIBUTION

The loans are to be considered as a contribution to the expenses related to the stay abroad.

The use of the Erasmus + contribution is incompatible with further grants deriving from other programs / actions funded by the European Union.

The amount of the contribution varies depending on:

1. Type of mobility (Long mobility or Short mobility for PhD students);
2. Country of destination.

The EU contribution for "LONG MOBILITY" mobility is related to the cost of the country of destination and the days of attendance certified by the partner university:

Program Countries

GROUP 1 HIGH cost of living:

Denmark, Finland, Ireland, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden.

350.00 euros

GROUP 2 AVERAGE cost of living:

Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, France, Germany, Greece, Malta, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain.

300.00 euros

GROUP 3 LOW cost of living:

Bulgaria, Croatia, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, North Macedonia, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Czech Republic, Turkey, Hungary.

250.00 euros

Partner Countries

United Kingdom, Switzerland

350.00 euros

PLEASE NOTE:

Mobility towards Switzerland, if financed directly by the Swiss government, will not receive the EU contribution.

The EU contribution for "SHORT MOBILITY" mobility (Program Countries only), disbursed for PhD students only, will be paid on the basis of a daily amount

Duration Daily contribution

"SHORT MOBILITY" mobility for a period between 5 and 14 days 70 euros

"SHORT MOBILITY" mobility for a period between 15 and 30 days 50 euros

In case of exhaustion of Erasmus + funds or if the student benefits from the simultaneous allocation of other university or EU funding, it will be possible to assign the student the status of "Erasmus zero eu-grant" which allows them to benefit from the facilities related to mobility, without receive the community contribution.

ART. 4.2 MUR AND SAPIENZA ADDITIONAL CONTRIBUTIONS FOR DISADVANTAGED ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

Mobility beneficiaries will be able to receive, in addition to the EU contribution, additional supplementary contributions from Sapienza and the Ministry for University and Research (MUR).

The assignment of the MUR contribution will be graded according to the economic condition of the student who is obliged to prove it through ISEE / ISEE PARIFICATO 2022 (ISEE for the right to university study DPCM 159/2013).

The data must be available on Infostud by 11/30/2022 or in any case before the acceptance of the terms of the financial agreement. Otherwise the MUR share cannot be attributed.

IMPORTANT:

- All students and / or doctoral students, postgraduates who in any capacity are exempted from submitting the ISEE for the purpose of paying taxes, to benefit from the supplementary MUR contribution;
- The Sapienza and MUR contributions will not be paid to students who are enrolled beyond the first year outside the current course (for the calculation, reference will be made to the year of enrollment at Sapienza, even in the case of transfer of the course).

Those who, by 31/12/2023, have not obtained the recognition in career of at least 6 credits, reduced to 3 credits for students who carry out exclusively research activities for the preparation of the thesis, will be required to return the total contribution. The career recognition must be completed exclusively by following the procedures digitized through the Erasmus personal page, which requires validation by the Academic Mobility Manager (see art.9).

The above limits do not apply to PhD and postgraduate students.

ART. 4.3 INTEGRATION FOR STUDENTS WITH DIFFERENT SKILLS AND / OR WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

1. In order to allow students to participate more widely in mobility, the Indire Erasmus + National Agency provides funds to support students with disabilities and / or special needs.
2. Interested students must report the disability / special need, both in the application phase and in the acceptance phase of the mobility.
3. Students wishing to take advantage of the special needs contribution will receive information on how to apply as soon as the Erasmus + INDIRE National Agency provides details, the information note will be published on the web page: <http://www.uniroma1.it/erasmus/students-students/erasmus-students-with-disabilities>
4. The funding of the contribution for special needs is subject to the allocation of funds from the Erasmus Plus INDIRE National Agency. If financial coverage is not available in whole or in part, the student will have to bear the expenses independently.

ART. 4.4 TAX TREATMENT OF THE ERASMUS + GRANT

Pursuant to Art. 1, paragraph 50 of Law no. 208 of 28.12.2015 the exemptions provided for in article 1, paragraph 3, of decree-law no. 105 of 9 May 2003, converted, with amendments, by law no. 170 of 11 July 2003, subject to further regulatory changes

ART. 5 - AVAILABLE OFFICES AND PLACES

When choosing mobility, please pay attention to the language level required for attendance at the host university. The requirements in the table have been indicated by the individual partner universities. Interested students are however invited to personally investigate the real correspondence of these requirements with respect to the requested locations.

PLEASE NOTE: The venues and available places may be subject to changes with respect to the Call, if there are changes introduced by the partner universities or by the European or national bodies that regulate the program. Before submitting the application, it is recommended to independently inquire about the possibilities of studying at foreign locations by checking the didactic offer on the website of the individual universities.

Furthermore, at the time of publication of the call for proposals, the agreements have not yet been officially stipulated since, as foreseen by the new Erasmus + 2021-27 program, the agreements must be digitally stipulated through the Erasmus Without Papers network, still in the technical implementation phase in all Program countries. Therefore, it is possible that some conditions change during the stipulation phase and that not all selected students can actually take part in the exchange and / or can do so with the conditions set out in this announcement. It will be the responsibility of the offices to ensure that this transition phase does not impact, as far as possible, the selection of students, but it is important that candidates are informed that all available seats, as published, are to be considered subject to conditions.

For students who have already benefited from previous mobility periods, the maximum duration will be reduced to the remaining months compared to the maximum limit of 12 months for the cycle of studies and 24 months for single-cycle degrees, subject to authorization by the destination site.

When choosing the venue, it is essential to pay attention to the language level required to be able to attend the chosen courses (see art. 2.3.2).

The student can apply from a minimum of 1 to a maximum of 3 destinations.

The order of priority indicated at the time of application will be binding for the assignment of the venue, in the event that the candidate is the winner in more than one venue.

It will NOT be possible to guarantee departure during the 1st semester to locations that have a deadline for sending the documentation of mobile students close to the date indicated in art. 14 "Term of the procedure of this announcement" for the publication of the rankings.

The double degree program is an integrated curriculum course of study which includes a training course designed specifically with the foreign university and a period of mobility.

The selected student will attend part of his career at Sapienza and part of his career at a foreign university using the services and facilities available without paying additional tuition fees.

The student will obtain an Italian and a foreign qualification of the same level and recognized in both countries involved only at the end of the two-year bachelor's and master's degrees. Upon graduation of a three-year degree, a Certificat d'Études Politiques will be issued.

The study path is structured as follows: first year at Sapienza, second year in Lille, third year at Sapienza (achievement of the three-year degree and acquisition of the Certificat d'Études Politiques), first year of master's degree in Lille, second year of master's degree at Sapienza University (achievement of a master's degree and recognition of the double degree)

Students who are awarded scholarships to non-EU / Double Degree Countries are required to pay the tuition fees exclusively to the University of Rome "La Sapienza", which, however, is not responsible for any participation fees imposed by host universities for mobile students.

This Call is open to:

- students enrolled in the first year of the three-year degree course in Political Sciences and International Relations (L-36) or in Administration and Organization Sciences (L-16)

To participate in the call, it is necessary to possess the following requirements:

- be regularly enrolled in the first year of the three-year degree course in Political Sciences and International Relations (L-36) or in Administration and Organization Sciences (L-16)
- be up to date with the payment of university fees;
- not be a resident of the country in which he intends to carry out the mobility;
- retain the status of student until the end of the period of study abroad and not obtain the qualification before recognition by the Academic Head of Mobility (RAM) of the educational activity carried out at the host university;
- possess adequate language skills required by the host university (French - level B1).
- not to benefit at the same time as the scholarship in question from contributions paid for another reason, for international exchanges or stays abroad, on Sapienza funds (it is possible to participate in several calls in the same academic year, if compatible with each other, but the period of study must be different. This scholarship cannot be combined with the contributions provided by the "Scholarship for thesis abroad" program);
- have passed the CFU required for the first year at Sapienza. For the purposes of the selection, the exams registered on Infostud on the expiry date of this announcement will be taken into consideration. A further check will be carried out upon departure.

Students definitively admitted to the program will carry out the second year at Sciences Po. - Lille, after having acquired all the credits required by the training plan of the degree course in which they are enrolled. To continue the double degree program and be admitted to the third year at Sapienza, it is necessary to have acquired 60 ECTS of the second year at Sciences Po. Lille as per the study plan of the double degree program attached to this announcement (Annex1). During the third year at Sapienza it will be possible to recover credits only up to a maximum of 9 ECTS.

ART. 6 TEACHING ACTIVITIES IN THE FOREIGN OFFICE

In the application form, the student must indicate the educational activities he intends to carry out abroad. In addition, he will have to consider the consistency between the disciplinary area of the host institution and his / her course of study. In the event of an application presented in the transition period between the first cycle

degree course and the second cycle degree course, it is necessary to consider the academic activities envisaged by the course of study relating to the second cycle degree.

The activities are indicative and do not preclude the possibility of integrating them when preparing the official study plan (the Learning Agreement described in Article 8) which must be approved by the Academic Mobility Manager (RAM) of the study program.

These activities are:

- Attendance of training activities (teachings) and passing the relevant assessment tests (exams);
- Preparation of the degree and / or doctoral thesis;
- Curricular internship (only if provided for by the educational system)

Doctoral students will have to agree on the training course abroad with the Coordinator of the doctoral course.

ART. 7.2 DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED

To complete the application correctly, interested students must fill in all the fields of the online form and make sure that they have uploaded the following documents, to be understood as an integral part of the application:

ART. 7.3 "SHORT MOBILITY" APPLICATION FOR PHD STUDENTS

The PhD students who intend to submit an application for the locations intended for them and who intend to carry out an Erasmus + "SHORT MOBILITY" mobility, are required to declare this during the application phase by putting a flag in the appropriate field corresponding to the selected university. . If the intention to carry out a short mobility has not been declared in the application, the mobility will be considered a long mobility and must comply with the established requirements (see Art 3 DURATION)

ART. 8 RANKINGS

ART. 8.1 FORMULATION OF RANKINGS

A Commission - composed of the CAM, RAM and RAEF and appointed by the RAM will evaluate the applications. The selection will be made according to the evaluation criteria listed below and formalized by the Commission in the settlement report, in full consistency with the elements subject to evaluation pursuant to art. 2.3.

Evaluation criteria for the selection are:

1. Academic merit, 0 - 2000 points (criterion applied only to students enrolled in a three-year or master's degree course):

Number of credits acquired (for those enrolled in a master's degree course, the 180 credits of the three-year career are added to the credits acquired) divided into the year of the course (for those enrolled in a master's degree course, the year of the course 3 years of the three-year career are added together) multiplied by the weighted average of the marks (for those enrolled in a master's degree course, the weighted average of the marks of the three-year career is also taken into consideration);

Note: the average of 30 cum laude is calculated as 31

2. Language skills, 400 - 2000 points:

assessed in accordance with the provisions of Article 2.4;

For the purposes of the ranking, the following scores correspond to the levels of linguistic competence:

C2 = 2000; C1 = 1600; B2 = 1200; B1 = 800; A2 = 400

3. Study Project and Motivation - from 0 to 400 points.

PLEASE NOTE: The following do NOT contribute to the calculation of the weighted average and of the acquired credits:

- Exams taken abroad during the Erasmus stay if not yet validated as they refer to exams for which the validation procedure has not yet been completed;
 - Extra-curricular exams pursuant to art. 6 of the Royal Decree n. 1269/38 since these exams do not contribute to the achievement of the credits required for the graduation and are not counted in the calculation of the average;
 - Integrated exams and ADE (elective teaching activities) if the credits relating to all the tests that make up each integrated exam have not been obtained;
 - "Single course" exams if they have not already been recognized in the Bachelor's Degree, single-cycle Master's Degree course or single-cycle course in which the student is enrolled for the current academic year;
 - Exams canceled due to non-compliance with the prerequisites;
 - Exams declared as taken and which are, on the other hand, only booked and not taken or, even, not booked.
- In assigning the mobility, with the same score, students who have never benefited from Erasmus mobility for study purposes, Erasmus placement / traineeship, will have priority.

ART. 8.2 ACCEPTANCE OF MOBILITY

After 10 days from the publication of the ranking, the winners must expressly accept the contribution within the following 7 days.

Failure to comply with the aforementioned deadline will be understood in terms of renunciation.

The definitive assignment of the Erasmus + mobility is subject to:

- upload of the required documents
- formalization of the Learning Agreement
- signing and uploading on the personal page of the financial agreement between the student and Sapienza which must take place before the actual start of the mobility; otherwise the student will not be authorized to take advantage of the mobility and will not receive any financial and insurance coverage, where applicable. The inclusion in the final rankings will not automatically entail the right to carry out a mobility period, since the actual assignment will also depend on the verification of compliance with the didactic constraints

(constraints / requirements defined by each Degree Course) defined by the Faculty and the seat of chosen destination.

ART. 8.3 WAIVER OF MOBILITY AND TAKE OVER

Acceptance of mobility is a serious commitment made by the candidate. Therefore, suitable students are invited to limit the renunciations, after acceptance or at the beginning of the mobility period, to serious and proven cases of force majeure, which must be communicated in writing and duly justified to allow the first reserve candidate the takeover in good time.

In case of renouncement, the Erasmus Departmental Office will proceed with the assignment of the mobility to the next students in the ranking who can then be contacted by e-mail and invited to reply within 3 working days, under penalty of revocation of the mobility.

ART. 9 LEARNING AGREEMENT

All students who have definitively accepted the assigned destination are required to fill in the official study plan (Learning Agreement - L.A.).

The L.A. it is a document that is prepared before departure and that defines the teaching activity to be carried out abroad (exams, thesis research).

The L.A. must be approved by the Academic Head of Mobility (RAM - List published at the link: <https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina/coordinatori-e-responsabili-accademici-mobilita-internazionale-0>) and be signed by the student concerned and by the host institution in order to guarantee the mobility student the recognition of the credits obtained after passing the relative exams / thesis abroad.

The student must complete the L.A. on your personal page at <https://relint.uniroma1.it/pp2013/login.aspx>
The definition and subsequent approval of the Learning Agreement are mandatory and binding for the purpose of using the mobility, under penalty of exclusion from the mobility itself.

ART. 10 PROCEDURAL INFORMATION AND LOGISTICS

In order to be able to formulate, with awareness, the curricular project that will be carried out at the destination University, students must consult the information available on the web pages of the host sites before submitting their application. This information will also be binding for the purposes of assigning the mobility.

For carrying out any research for a degree, PhD or Specialization thesis, after consulting the web page of the host university, the research project must be agreed in advance with the Italian supervisor and Academic Head of Mobility, on the basis of the agreements established with the partner professor of the foreign university. Erasmus students, at the end of the courses, will have to take the verification tests according to the programs and procedures provided for the students of the host universities. The recognition of the didactic activities carried out will take place as indicated by the Faculty and by the "Regulations for student mobility and the recognition of study and training periods abroad". Credits relating to exams taken at the host universities must be acquired in compliance with any preparatory constraints provided for in the organization of the degree course.

It should be noted that foreign universities rarely offer accommodation to Erasmus students in their own facilities. Any information can be found on the web pages of the partner universities, the student is required to check any deadlines or specific procedures to follow.

The student will also have to independently inquire about any rules governing:

- health care in the host country, by contacting your ASL or diplomatic representations and consulting the link http://www.salute.gov.it/portale/temi/p2_6.jsp?lingua=italiano&id=897 & area = Assistenza% 20sanitaria & menu = Italians
- entry into the host country, by contacting the relevant diplomatic representations (Embassies and Consulates) in Italy in time (if a non-EU citizen).

The legislation and regulations governing the entry of non-EU students into the countries participating in the Erasmus + Program are linked to the nationality of these students: it is the student's responsibility to collect the information in advance and obtain the documents that will allow entry and stay in the country of destination, by contacting the respective diplomatic representations.

The accident and civil liability insurance that the student automatically benefits from when enrolling at the University is extended, in the same way, for the entire period of stay abroad at the destination institution:

Mobility students are required to:

- b) independently inquire about any rules governing entry to the host country, by contacting the relevant diplomatic representations (Embassies and Consulates) in Italy in good time.

The processing of personal data is governed by the new European Regulation no. 679 of 27.4.2016 - GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) as well as by the national legislation in force).
