ART. 1 GENERAL INFORMATION

ART. 1.1 OBJECTIVES

Erasmus+ individual learning mobility is regulated by the Erasmus+ programme 2021/2027. (EU Regulation no.2021/817 of the European Parliament and of the Council of May 20, 2021 and the Erasmus+ Programme Guide 2021/2027). Through lifelong learning, the Programme promotes educational, professional and personal development of students and promotes sustainable growth, employment, innovation, social cohesion, the strengthening of the European identity and active citizenship.

The Erasmus+ programme also allows participation in non-EU countries, known as Partner Countries. The European countries traditionally included in the Erasmus+ programme are referred to as the Programme Countries.

Erasmus students receive a grant and have the right to:

- attend courses and use the available structures at the hosting institution without further tuition fees (in some cases small contributions might be requested as for local students);
- combine a period of study with a period of traineeship or research for the preparation of the thesis;
- carry out research under the PhD or Specialisation School;

All activities conducted abroad (with a positive outcome) will be fully recognized in the student's career as long as they were previously approved by the Learning Agreement/Change Form. Full recognition of activities carried out abroad is one of the commitments undertaken by Sapienza University of Rome with the approval of the Erasmus Policy Statement (EPS) and the "Regulation for Student Mobility and Recognition of Study and Training Periods Abroad".

ART. 1.2 MOBILITY TOWARDS CIVIS ALLIANCE UNIVERSITIES

Sapienza is a partner of the "CIVIS - A European Civic University" Alliance financed by the European Union. The alliance has been active since October 1, 2019 and includes the following universities:

ART.1.3 PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES

It will be possible to participate in the Erasmus+ programme by study at the universities with which Sapienza has signed an interinstitutional agreement, included in one of the following country groups:

- **Programme Countries** that include: Member States of the European Union, the Countries of the European Economic Area (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway) and the Countries applying for accession to the EU (Turkey, Serbia and the Republic of North Macedonia);
- Partner Countries: United Kingdom and Switzerland.

ART. 1.4 DOUBLE DEGREE MOBILITY

The Double Degree programmes allow students to spend a period of study abroad by attending courses aimed at obtaining the Italian title and the foreign title of equal level. General information is available at: https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina/titoli-doppi-multipli-e-congiunti.

Conditions for participation vary depending on the foreign University, the year of enrolment/attendance, the academic requirements which are regulated by special agreements about the duration of mobility, the programme of studies and the recognition of academic activities carried out at the foreign office and the number of places available.





Students selected for a DOUBLE DEGREE PROGRAMME may apply for this call only for the seats reserved to this type of programme (see Art. 4 "AVAILABLE DESTINATIONS AND PLACES").

Double degree mobilities will be expressly indicated in the table, where you will find information on the locations and places available.

ART. 2 REQUIREMENTS

ART. 2.1 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. In order to apply to this call students must be enrolled (including part-time students) at Sapienza for **Academic Year 2021/22** in a Bachelor's, Master's, Single-cycle or PhD degree programmes, or Specialisation Schools.
- 2. In case of Specialisation Programmes, the payment of the Erasmus grant is subject to the compatibility of the specialisation contract with Erasmus grants. Incompatibility still allows participation in the programme, but students will not receive any grant for the mobility period.
- 3. Students must have adequate language skills (see Art. 2.4 "LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS").
- 4. Students must complete their enrolment at Sapienza University for Academic Year 2022/2023 by the established deadlines (further information: https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina-strutturale/studenti "University Tuition"), except for graduating students, under Art. 13 of the "Student Regulations". Hence, students who plan to graduate in the extraordinary session Academic Year 2021/2022 do not have to enrol for the A.Y. 2022/2023, but the mobility must be concluded before graduation. In case of missed graduation within the extraordinary session A.Y. 2021/2022, enrolment for the Academic Year 2022/2023 would be required.
- 5. Students enrolled in the third (or subsequent) year of a Bachelor's Programme (First cycle) in Academic Year 2021/2022, and who expect to graduate by the end of the academic year, may apply for a mobility period for the first year of a Master's Degree (Second cycle). However, the mobility period must take place in the second semester of Academic Year 2022/2023. If such students apply for mobility periods longer than a semester, the period will be automatically reduced. Before leaving, students selected under these conditions must be enrolled in a Master's Programme for Academic Year 2022/2023. Moreover, these students may not, under any circumstance, enjoy their mobility period during the first semester.
- 6. Graduating students on Erasmus mobility are allowed to graduate only after the end of their study period abroad and once the online recognition procedure for the educational activity scheduled in the Learning Agreement/ Change Form (exams or thesis research) is completed. If the above requirements are not complied, students have to refund the grant (Article 9 Learning Agreement).
- 7. **PhD Students** must complete their mobility period before the official end of the Doctoral Programme and obtain a Declaration concerning the activity carried out from the host university.





8. **Specialisation students** must be **authorised** by the Director of their Specialisation School to benefit from a mobility period and also obtain a Declaration concerning the activity carried out from the host university.

ART. 2.2 INCOMPATIBILITY

Students applying to this call may benefit from one or more Erasmus+ mobility grants (Bachelor's, Master's, PhDs) provided <u>the total period does not exceed 12 months per each cycle</u>. For Single-cycle degrees the maximum period is 24 months.

Any Erasmus mobility carried out in virtual mode from the country of residence, will not be counted in the computing of the maximum Erasmus mobility months for each cycle.

Each candidate is responsible for verifying the residual number of Erasmus mobility months for the cycle they are enrolled in and asking for a possible reduction of the mobility period if not compatible. Otherwise the mobility could be cancelled and the grants already paid must be returned.

Please note: as per Art. 76 - D.P.R. 28.12.2000 N. 445 "... whoever provides false declarations, false acts or uses them for the purposes of the present call is liable for punishment as established by legislation and all special bills in this matter."

Prior mobility periods that have already been funded during the same study cycle under: ICM (International Credit Mobility), Lifelong Learning Programme, Erasmus+, Erasmus Mundus Action 1 and Erasmus Mundus Action 2 are included in the calculation of the total number of months spent abroad.

ART. 2.3 ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

Students with the following academic requirements can apply for the Erasmus call (Faculty of Law):

- 1. it is necessary to be enrolled in a degree course of the Faculty of Law and to have obtained a minimum of 24 credits;
- 2. students must have taken the language exam at the Sapienza University or present a B2 level language certificate. The Faculty commission reserves the right to verify (during or after the application) the attached certification and other B2 level certificates obtained at Sapienza or the CLA, as an alternative to the B2 obtained at Faculty of Law;
- 3. it is possible to be enrolled in a PhD course, only without a scholarship, in one of the chairs indicated below;
- 4. students enrolled in a PhD course must have the authorization of the PhD coordinator;
- 5. graduates who carry out post-graduate professional internships cannot participate;
- 6. all credits obtained up to the sending of the application will be considered, for exams recorded on Infostud. Subsequently attached documents cannot be considered (see art. 6);
- 7. the recognition of credits obtained in Erasmus must take place before the discussion of the thesis and the conclusion of the course attended;





- 8. all credits accrued up to the time of submitting the application will be taken into consideration for exams recorded on infostud at the deadline for submitting the application;
- 9. these requirements have been included because they are considered essential to guarantee a solid legal basis for the winning students, who will be able to add exams taken abroad to complement and supplement their preparation;
- 10. some exams carried out abroad will not be recognized. These are those that cannot be considered equivalent for the subject matter.

A special complementary form to confirm the equivalence will be available at the Erasmus office in paper format or can be requested via email from erasmuslaw@uniroma1.it.

It is not possible to take the following exams abroad: Civil Procedure, Criminal Procedure, Administrative Procedure, which have to be taken at Sapienza. It is necessary to respect any prerequisites to take the exam.

2. All credits acquired until the application submission, obtained exclusively through exams and officially registered on Infostud, will be accepted for the selection process. Students may self-certify exams they have taken, but that have not yet been registered on Infostud, on their application.

ART. 2.4 LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Students applying to the Call must have a <u>minimum A2 language level</u> Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) recognised by the European Council https://www.coe.int/en/web/common-european-framework-reference-languages

Candidates must demonstrate their linguistic competence through:

- a passed test in November 2021, January or February 2022 sessions at the CLA (Sapienza LanguageCentre), before sending the online application;
- a passed CLA test for the previous call (Bando Erasmus+ 2021/2022). Students who do not want to use this exemption, may retake the CLA test. In this case, the new result (higher, lower or failed score for the language test repeated) will replace the previous one;

the satisfaction of the requirements described in Article 2.4.3 "LANGUAGE TEST EXEMPTIONS".

Tests or other exemption certificates must be obtained before sending the online application.

PLEASE NOTE: the CLA test does not exempt students from verifying and complying with the language requirements of the host university, which must be respected to benefit from the selected mobility.

The result of the test is a requirement for the candidacy and could constitute an element of evaluation to be placed in the ranking, if it were to certify the knowledge of a third foreign language.





ART, 2.4.1 LANGUAGE TESTS

The tests – only for FRENCH, ENGLISH, PORTUGUESE, SPANISH, GERMAN – will be held in presence at CLA and students must attend the test with a valid ID (identity card, passport or driving licence).

Students who had not already taken the test in the sessions of November 2021 or January 2022, must book the time and date for the test among the available options listed in the application form, according to the following schedule:

- from February 14 to February 18, 2022, with two shifts at 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM;
- from February 21 to February 22, 2022, with two shifts at 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM.

PLEASE NOTE: only available dates and shifts will be displayed on the application form.

Test registration is valid only if you receive a confirmation e-mail on your university account.

Students can take tests for a maximum of two languages based on the selected destinations, mandatorily on the same day and shift/time. Only one test can be taken for each language.

The language tests are multistage (students can progress to the next level only if they reach the minimum score) with:

- multiple choice questions;
- cloze questions;
- drag and drop texts.

Tests are mainly focused on grammar knowledge and text comprehension with no speaking and listening.

The level starts at A2 and progresses step by step, based on your score, up to level C1. Maximum amount of time permitted is 60 minutes (if you complete all four levels). Online mock tests are not available.

PLEASE NOTE: there will be no recovery sessions.

Students who have already taken the test in November 2021 or January 2022 cannot retake the test for the same languages.

There will be a maximum of 340 available places per day (170 students per shift) and each shift may be booked as long as places are available.

We recommend you to book your tests as soon as possible to have the widest possible choice in the available dates.

The results of February 2022 session will be published on Moodle, but they will be imported on the application only if students open the form at the following link: https://relint.uniroma1.it/candidatura/login.aspx

Students who have already taken the CLA test in November 2021 and January 2022 are invited to log in their application form to allow the import of the test score by February 15, 2022.

The attestation of the score obtained <u>at the language test will be issued only to students who are assignee of an Erasmus mobility</u>. This attestation is NOT a legal language certificate and it can be downloaded directly from the Erasmus personal page.

ART. 2.4.2 INFORMATION FOR DISABLED STUDENTS AND SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH LEARNING DISORDERS.

Students with disabilities (as per Art. 3 of Bill N. 104/1992) and/or disabilities equal or greater to 66% are exempt from the computer-delivered language test. They must indicate this on the language test booking form. The CLA will test student language knowledge on the basis of suitable procedures.

Students with learning disorders (as per Bill N. 170/2010 and DM N. 5669/2011) who require specific aid to complete the test, must indicate this on their language test booking form. Candidates with learning disorders will be given 30% additional time.

Particular situations will be examined on the basis of the provided certifications.

All requests must be submitted by the language test registration deadline (see Art.2.4.1. "LAN-GUAGE TESTS") and will be verified by the Office for Students with Disabilities and Specific Learning Difficulties, which may request official certifications from the National Health Service or accredited specialists and facilities.

Learning disorder certification must refer to official reading/writing/calculation levels. Diagnosis must be updated after 3 years, if it was issued to a minor.

PLEASE NOTE: students with disabilities or learning disorders, who are resident abroad and intend to enjoy the measures described above, must submit certifications issued in their country of residence together with a sworn translation into Italian or English.

ART. 2.4.3 EXEMPTION FROM LANGUAGE TESTS

Students with the following requisites are exempted from the CLA language test, but must still observe minimum requisites required by the host university:

- 1) Students who have passed the language test held at CLA for application to the Erasmus+call for A.Y. 2021-22, under conditions set in Article 2.4.
- 2) Mother tongue for the language selected for the mobility; as indicated by the Ministry of Public Education with Circular N. 5494 29/12/1982 (ref: C.U.N. 30/10/1982), the quality of a foreign mother tongue speaker is recognised for "Italian and foreign citizens only when





it is proven that they have completed at least all of their elementary and secondary education in the country where that language is spoken, either at public or (recognized) private schools of the same nationality." Mother tongue language level corresponds to level C2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

- 3) You have an official **certificate for level A2** issued by an agency recognized by CEFR (see Annex 1) for the language/s selected for mobility.
- 4) Enrolment in a Sapienza degree programme that is held entirely in English, only in case the student applies for a destination that requires English for mobility purposes.
- 5) High School Diploma from an international lyceum recognised by MUR for English, French (ESABAC diploma), German, Spanish or Portuguese. (A High School Diploma at an international high school corresponds to level B2).
- 6) Level A2 language skills acquired during a mobility period in academic year 2019/2020 and 2020/2021 for at least one of the languages indicated in Art. 2.4.1 "LANGUAGE TESTS" issued by the Language Centre at the host university.
- 7) Bilingual when the second language is the same one selected for the mobility (bilingual status is acknowledged to students who have completed at least the primary, secondary and high school cycles in the Special Administrative Regions or in the Autonomous Provinces in which bilingualism exists according to the regional law). Students who want to make use of this exemption need to provide a self-declaration in accordance with D.P.R. 445/2000.

PLEASE NOTE:

- If students intend to apply for a host university that requires a higher level than the one required in the cases above, or where a different language is required, they will have to take the CLA test.
- Students enrolled in an English course will be exempted from taking the test only if the
 language level needed in their degree programme is the same (or higher) of the one requested
 by the host university.

<u>Language tests taken as part of a degree programme do NOT exempt you from the CLA Test</u>. Similarly, declarations issued by professors, even university professors, and language exams will not be considered valid.

ART. 2.5 OTHER REQUIREMENTS

This call is not open to students enrolled in inter-faculty courses.

This call is NOT open to students enrolled in other Faculties.





It is possible to participate by being enrolled in the PhD of the Faculty of Law as long as they have

been assigned a PhD position without an economic grant in one of the following chairs:

ART. 3 DURATION





The length of the mobility is defined by the inter-institutional agreement signed between Sapienza and the partner universities.

The mobility can be started from June 1, 2022, to be concluded by September 30, 2023 and should be performed continuously. The duration could be reduced compared to the call-in case the semester period does not coincide with the academic calendar of the foreign university.

There are two types of mobility:

Erasmus LONG MOBILITY for I, II and III study cycle:

It can be carried out by all those belonging to the I, II and III cycle at the partner universities (Programme Countries and Partner Countries, see Art. 1.3 Participating Countries). Each long mobility must have a minimum duration of 2 months (60 days) and maximum 12 or 24 months (in case of single cycle).

The duration could change only for well-proved academic reasons in which the students:

Start the mobility in the second semester,

Have already benefited from mobility periods in the same cycle (Art. 2.2). In this case the maximum length will be reduced to the residual months according to the limit of 12 per cycle and 24 months for single cycle, subject to prior approval of the partner university.

Erasmus SHORT MOBILITY only for PhD students:

The short mobility can be carried out only by students enrolled in a PhD Programme. It must have a minimum duration of 5 days and maximum 30 days and it should be performed only in Programme Countries.

The short mobility must always be previously authorised by the host university (see Art. 7.3 APPLICATION "SHORT MOBILITY" FOR PhD STUDENTS).

ART. 4 GRANTS

The determination of grants will be subject to the approval of the agreement with the National Agency Erasmus+ Indire and the University Board of Governors.

Mobility grants are assigned exclusively for academic activities at the partner university (see art. 6 "ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES ABROAD"). In order to receive Erasmus grants, the mobility student must accept the terms of the financial contract before departure and follow the instructions that will be provided at the time of the assignment of the mobility.

ART. 4.1. EU GRANTS

Grants must be considered as a contribution to the expenses related to their stay abroad.

Erasmus EU grants are incompatible with grants from other programmes/actions funded by the European Union.

The amount of grants varies according to:

- 1. Type of mobility (Long mobility o Short mobility for PhD students);
- 2. Destination Country.

The EU Grants for "LONG MOBILITY", is related to living cost of destination country and to the days of attendance certified by the partner Universities:

Mobility to Switzerland, if directly financed by the Swiss Government, will not receive the EU Grant

In case EU funds are depleted, and/or students receive other university or EU grants, students may receive an "Erasmus-Zero-EU-Grant" status that will allow them to enjoy the benefits of the mobility period, but without receiving an EU grant.

ART. 4.2 ADDITIONAL MUR AND SAPIENZA GRANT FOR STUDENTS WITH DISAD-VANTAGED BACKGROUNDS

In addition to the EU grant, mobility students will receive additional funding from Sapienza and the Ministry of University and Research (MUR).

The MUR grant allocation will be paid according to the economic conditions of students who are obliged to prove it through ISEE/ISEE PARIFICATO 2022 (ISEE for right to university study DPCM 159/2013).

The data must be available on Infostud by November 30, 2022 or before the acceptance of the terms of the Financial Agreement. Otherwise the MUR grant cannot be allocated.

IMPORTANT:

- All students and/or PhD students, Specialisation School students who are exempted from submitting the ISEE for the payment of fees, in order to benefit from the MUR Grant, will still have to apply for the ISEE 2022 (ISEE for right to university study);
- The Sapienza and the MUR grants will not be paid to irregular students (beyond the allotted time to attain a degree) from the second year onwards (calculation will take the initial enrolment year at Sapienza into account, also in case of transfer to another degree programme).

Students who do not obtain, by December 31,2023, the online recognition of at least 6 CFUs (reduced to 3 CFUs for students who perform exclusively research activities for the preparation of the thesis),





will be required to refund the total grant. Credit recognition must be completed exclusively through the digitised procedures on the Erasmus personal page, which provides for validation by the Academic Coordinator for International Mobility (RAM, Article 9).

The above limits do not apply to PhD students and Specialisation School students.

ART. 4.3 ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR DISABLED STUDENTS AND/OR STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

- 1. In order to allow a wider student participation in the mobility programme, Indire the National Agency for Erasmus+ allocates grants intended to support disabled students and/or students with special needs.
- 2. Students must communicate their disability/special need both through their application form and upon acceptance, if assigned a mobility period.
- 3. The above-mentioned selected students will receive information about the application as soon as Indire the National Agency for Erasmus+ provides details; the relevant note will be published on the webpage http://www.uniroma1.it/erasmus/studenti-students/erasmus-studenti-diversamente-abili.
- 4. The financing of the Grant for special needs will be subject to the allocation of funds from the National Agency Erasmus Plus INDIRE. If financial coverage is not available in full or in part, students will have to bear the costs themselves.

ART. 4.4 TAXATION OF THE ERASMUS + GRANT

Under Article 1, paragraph 50, Law No 208 - 28.12.2015, grants for international mobility are subject to the exemptions provided by Article 1, paragraph 3, Decree-Law N. 105 - 9 May 2003, converted with amendments into Law N. 170 - 11 July 2003, except further amendments.

ART. 5 AVAILABLE DESTINATIONS AND PLACES

- 1. Students may apply to minimum 1 and maximum 5 destinations.
- 2. The priority order indicated on your application is binding for the assignment of destinations, if the candidate is eligible for more than one destination. Please make sure you have the necessary language level that will allow you to attend lessons and take exams at the chosen destination (See Art. 2.4 "LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS").

PLEASE NOTE: In selecting possible destinations, students must keep in mind that only two language tests are allowed, in addition to any applicable exemptions (see Art. 2.4.3 "EXEMPTION FROM LANGUAGE TESTS")

However, it is important that candidates are aware that the availability of all the places published in the call is under condition.

4. It will not be possible to guarantee the start of a mobility period in the 1st semester for destinations that have a deadline (for the submission of the student nomination) that is not compatible with the publication of the final ranking (Art. 14 "END OF PROCEDURE").

The duration of the mobility indicated in the announcement is determined on the basis of contracts between sapienza and partner university and cannot be changed by the student.

Any changes must be authorized by the academic director Prof. Gianluca Scarchillo. They will be evaluated only in the case of proven didactic reasons in the event that the student:

- 1) you start the mobility in the second semester
- 2) has already benefited from mobility periods in the same cycle of studies (art.2.2.) The maximum duration will be reduced to the remaining months based on 12 months for the study cycle and 24 months for single-cycle degrees, subject to authorization by the Partner University.

The overall duration of the mobility must not be less than 90 days.

When choosing mobility, it is necessary to pay attention to the required language level. The requirements indicated in the table have been indicated by the partner universities. Interested students are invited to personally investigate the actual correspondence of these requirements with what is required by the Partner Universities.

ART. 6 ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES ABROAD





Students must indicate the didactic activities they intend to pursue abroad in the Application Form. In addition, they have to consider the coherence between the subject area of the host university and their own course of study. In case of applications submitted in the transition period between a Bachelor's (I cycle) and a Master's Degree (II cycle), students should consider the academic activities scheduled for the Master's Study Plan.

The indicated activities are not final and may be integrated upon completion of the official study plan (Art. 9 "LEARNING AGREEMENT") that will have to be approved by the Degree Programme Academic Coordinator for International Mobility (RAM).

Admissible mobility activities are:

- Attendance of courses and exams;
- Research for graduation and/or doctoral thesis;
- Curricular traineeship (only if relevant to the didactic plan)

After having consulted the course catalogue of the foreign university, students should contact the Agreement Promoter (Art. 4. AVAILABLE DESTINATIONS AND PLACES) for didactic information.

PhD students and candidates enrolled in Specialisation Schools, after having verified their eligibility for a mobility period abroad, must agree on the educational programme abroad with the Coordinator of their PhD Programme/Specialisation School. Moreover, they will have to ascertain their insurance coverage with the relevant offices.

ART. 7 APPLICATION

ART. 7.1 DEADLINES AND SUBMISSION

- 1. The deadline for submission of the on-line application form is March 4, 2022. at 2.00 pm (Italian time).
- 2. The application form is available at: https://relint.uniroma1.it/candidatura/login.aspx For technical issues, please contact the Help Desk form, available at the following link: https://relint.uniroma1.it/candidatura/sendmail.aspx
- 3. In order to apply, you must use your university email account (familyname.studentnum-ber@studenti.uniroma1.it).

This will be the <u>only official means used for communications</u> related to this call and the subsequent procedures.

Once the application has been completed, candidates will receive a report of all the data submitted at their university email address as the only valid receipt for their application. Thus, all applicants must verify that they receive this report and that all the data submitted is correct. Any errors must be immediately reported to the Faculty Erasmus Administrative Officer: erasmuslaw@uniroma1.it

The correct submission of the application is certified only by the receipt of the submission by the student. Incomplete applications will be considered inadmissible. Maximum attention is recommended in compiling all the steps, the motivational part, the learning agreement with the study plan, which will be evaluated during the interview.





Where requested, candidates will deliver a double copy in paper version, signed, attaching a photo ID and the necessary documentation (e.g. copy of identity document, language certificates). The deadline is set for 5 March 2022 at 12 p.m. at the Erasmus Office.

ART, 7.2 DOCUMENTS TO SUBMIT

In order to correctly complete the application process, students must fill out all fields of the on-line form and verify the upload of the following documents, which are an integral part of the application process:

- 1. Scan of a valid identity document,
- 2. Language Certification (only in the case provided in Article 2.4.3 "EXEMPTION FROM LANGUAGE TESTS")

PLEASE NOTE: If mandatory documents are not uploaded by the deadline, or the declared/self-certified information is not correct, the application will be rejected.

ART. 7.3 SHORT MOBILITY APPLICATION FOR PhD STUDENTS

PhD students who wish to apply for an Erasmus+ "SHORT MOBILITY" are required to declare it when applying by flagging the proper field next to the selected university. If students do not declare their willingness to carry out a short mobility in their application, the mobility will be considered as a "LONG MOBILITY" and will have to comply with the related requirements (Article 3 DURATION).

Before the start of the mobility, the Faculty Erasmus office will have to acquire formal confirmation of the "Short mobility" from the host University.

ART. 8 RANKING

ART. 8.1 RANKING PROCESS

- 1. A Commission made up of the Faculty CAM / RAM, the RAEF, the Erasmus Office Coordinator, Student Manager will evaluate the applications. The selection will be made (by qualifications), according to the evaluation criteria defined below and subject to the preliminary evaluation of the Faculty CAM / RAM and RAEF in full consistency with the elements subject to evaluation pursuant to art. 2.3.
- 2. Two rankings will not be drawn up: a ranking for the CIVIS alliance locations and one for the other Erasmus + destinations, with all students competing for both categories of agreement.





- 3. The selection will be made by qualifications according to the evaluation criteria that will be formalized by the Commission in the establishment report and will in any case be defined in full consistency with the elements being evaluated. The final score will be determined by the following parameters:
- year of enrollment (does not award points);
- academic year enrollment (does not award points; necessary to verify the presence of faculty requirements. It is necessary to have obtained at least 24 credits)
- Ratio between the credits earned and the number of credits to be achieved depending on the year of enrollment (on a scale of value from 24 to 300 and, depending on the course year, from 60 to 300);
- Average rating (on a scale of value from 18 to 30);
- A maximum of three additional points for certified knowledge, with official attestation, of a third language (on a scale of 1 to 3).
- A maximum of three penalty points for each year of off-course enrollment (on a scale of value from 1 to 3 in deduction).
- A maximum of 15 points following the interview which will evaluate the qualifications attached to the submission of the application, the motivation expressed in the choice of the partner university, the proposed Learning Agreement and the evaluation made by the student on the selected courses as well as all the circumstances that the student will want to report in addition to the application presented

During the compilation phase, the student is required to draw up a detailed provisional LA indicating at the bottom of the same the link to the page of the host faculty from which he has extracted the name of the selected exams.

In assigning the mobility, with the same score, students who have never benefited from Erasmus mobility for study purposes, Erasmus placement / traineeship will have priority.

On the basis of the aforementioned criteria, the Commission will draw up a provisional ranking.

The provisional ranking will be published on the Faculty of Law website at the link: http://www.ius-sapienza.org/drupaluni/ and / or in the transparency section of the Faculty website at the link http://www.ius-sapienza.org/drupaluni/facolta/trasparenza

PLEASE NOTE: the following do not concur to the calculation of your GPA and CFUs:

- Exams taken abroad during Erasmus periods that have not yet been validated through the online recognition procedure;
- Extracurricular exams (former Art. 6 Regio Decreto N. 1269/38) as they do not count for CFUs necessary to graduate;
- Integrated exams and elective educational activities (ADE) if the credits related to all the modules of each integrated exam have not been completed yet;





- Exams for single courses that have not been recognised as part of the degree programme (Bachelor's, Master's, Single Cycle) where the student is currently enrolled;
- Exams cancelled due to lack of prerequisites;
- Exams declared as taken, which instead are only or not even booked.

In assigning mobility periods, in case of identical scores, priority will be given to students who have never benefited from an Erasmus mobility for study and placement/traineeship.

Based on the aforementioned criteria, the Commission will draw up a provisional ranking which will be published at the link http://www.iussapienza.org/drupaluni/ and / or in the transparency section of the Faculty website at the link http://www.ius-sapienza.org/drupaluni/ faculty / transparency

The ranking will be considered final if from the date of publication, after 10 consecutive calendar days, no complaints are submitted to be sent in a sealed envelope to the Faculty Erasmus Office for the attention of the Academic Coordinator for Mobility (CAM) Prof. Gianluca Scarchillo.

The final ranking will be published on the Faculty website http://www.iussapienza.org/drupaluni/and / or in the transparency section of the Faculty website at the link http://www.ius-sapienza.org/drupaluni/facolta/trasparenza.

ART. 8.2 ACCEPTANCE OF MOBILITY PERIOD

After 10 days from the publication of the ranking, the winners must expressly accept the contribution at the assignment meeting which will subsequently be organized at the Faculty of Law, classroom designanda.

It is also specified that participation in the aforementioned meeting is mandatory and that the absence of the candidate (or his / her delegate with a copy of the document and signed authorization) will not allow the assignment of any destination destination among those chosen which will therefore be assigned to candidates in the classroom in order of ranking.

Due to the high number of questions that are received every year, all interested students are recommended to evaluate ex ante the real intention to participate in the Erasmus + program, in this regard we inform you that the non-participation in the meeting as well as the renunciation of the departure formulated following the assignment will not allow you to participate in the Erasmus + Call in the year following that of submission of the application.

Presence in the final ranking does not automatically mean the student will enjoy the mobility period, as this depends on the background check conducted by the Faculty and host university on requirements and prerequisites.

PLEASE NOTE: the student's mobility is subject to acceptance by the foreign Institution which may require further certificates or reject the application on the basis of regulations that are not specified in the inter-institutional agreement signed with the partner University.

ART. 8.3 REFUSAL OF THE MOBILITY AND REPLACEMENT





The acceptance of mobility is a serious commitment for the candidate. Thus, selected candidates are expected to limit refusals, after acceptance or at the beginning of the mobility period, on account of serious and proven matters of force majeure, which must be communicated in writing and duly justified to allow replacement by the first reserve candidate in due time.

Failure to attend the meeting as well as the renunciation of departure formulated following the assignment, DO NOT allow you to participate in the Erasmus + call in the year following that of participation in the application.

ART. 9 LEARNING AGREEMENT

All students who have accepted their assigned destination must complete an official Learning Agreement (LA) which defines the academic activities to be completed abroad. The LA guarantees the recognition of credits obtained for passed exams and thesis research work conducted abroad.

The completion and approval of the Learning Agreement are mandatory and binding to enjoy your mobility period. Failure to do so will cause your exclusion.

All students who have definitively accepted the assigned mobility are required to complete the official study plan (Learning Agreement - L.A.) before departure and in any case by the deadline dates communicated by the Faculty Erasmus Office.

The L.A., which guarantees the student the recognition of credits obtained by passing the exams / thesis research abroad, must be:

-completed online by the student on their personal page at https://relint.uni-roma1.it/pp2013/login.aspx

approved online by the Academic Head of Mobility (RAM - List published at the link: https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina/coordinatori-e-responsabili-accademici-mobilita-internazionale-0

-signed by the student

-approved by the partner University by stamp and signature

The definition and consequent approval of the L.A. they are mandatory and binding for the purpose of using the mobility, under penalty of exclusion from the mobility itself.

The L.A. it must include exams or didactic activities aimed at obtaining at least 18 ECTS per semester (36 for periods of stay of 9 or 10 months).

Please note that the student who does not obtain at least 6 ECTS in the validation phase will be required to return the MIUR contribution: PhD students and postgraduates are excluded from this limit.

It should also be remembered that successfully passing the exams present in the L.A. will allow the recognition of 3 exams per semester (6 for a stay of 9 or 10 months) to be deducted from those in the Italian study plan.





The status of Erasmus student and the ownership of the relative contribution will be acquired only following the stipulation of the financial contract.

-The final acceptance of the student and the assessment of the adequacy of his profile and his linguistic preparation are the responsibility of the host university. The same may request further certifications from the candidate and, failing that, may refuse the application based on its own rules not specified in the agreement signed with the Faculty / University.

At the end of the mobility, the student must compulsorily start the validation procedure for the recognition in career of the academic or research activity carried out at the foreign university.

The digitized procedure must be completed exclusively through the Erasmus personal page. Otherwise, the student will be required to refund the total amount of the MUR contribution. ART. 10

ART. 10 PROCEDURES AND LOGISTICS

In order to prepare their curricular project at the host university, students should carefully examine all available information on the university websites before applying. In fact, this information is binding for the mobility assignment.

For degree, PhD or Specialisation thesis work, students must agree on the project with their Italian Supervisor and Academic Coordinator for International Mobility, based on the agreement with the partner professor at the host university.

At the end of their courses, Erasmus students must take the planned exams following the programmes and procedures provided for students of the host university. Academic activities will be recognized as indicated by the Faculty and the "Regulation for Student Mobility and Recognition of Study Periods and Training Abroad". Credits for exams taken at host universities must be acquired respecting all the rules and regulations of degree programme curricula.

Students must autonomously acquire information regarding housing opportunities provided by destination universities. Moreover, students are also responsible for informing themselves about:

- Health Assistance in the host country, requesting information from their local health office, diplomatic missions or at the following link http://www.salute.gov.it
- Entrance into the host country, timely checking for requirements with embassies and consulates (for non-EU citizens). Laws regulating the entrance of non-EU students in countries participating in the Erasmus+ Programme are based on the nationality of these students. Students are responsible for promptly obtaining information and all the documents needed to be admitted and allowed to sojourn in the destination country from the relevant diplomatic missions.

The civil liability and accident insurance coverage that students get automatically when enrolled at Sapienza is extended with the same procedures for the entire mobility period abroad at the host university https://www.uniroma1.it/it/node/24654

However, students are recommended to consider the opportunity of an additional insurance to cover travel and medical costs not covered by the European Health Care Card (TEAM).

It is also recommended to visit the webpage of the <u>Ministry of Foreign Affairs</u> (www.dovesiamonelmondo.it) and register your stay abroad filling with the required data: name, city/country, host university, updated contact info and period of stay.

ART. 11 CHECKS

As per Article 71 - DPR 445 - 28/12/2000, the university administration will verify all application





information through random checks on any candidature application that poses reasonable doubts on the information provided through self-certifications.

Non-compliance of information, declared or self-certified, constitutes a cause of exclusion/forfeiture.

ART. 12 PERSONAL DATA PROCESSING

The protection of personal data is regulated by the new European Regulation n. 679 - 27.4.2016 – GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) as well as current national legislation.

ART. 13 FINAL AUTHORITY

ART. 14 END OF PROCEDURE

The deadline of 7 April 2022 is the day by which it is assumed that the selection will be concluded. This call is also available in Italian.

In case of conflicting interpretation between the English and Italian versions of this call, the Italian language version prevails.
