This substantial strand of my research focuses on the urban manifestations of conflict and post-conflict. It advances intellectual debates on the role of the built environment in conflict, on practices of sovereignty, and onthe lived experience of contested cities. This research, originally developed via a doctoral scholarship at

Newcastle University, has been subsequently funded by a British Academy post-doctoral fellowship (PDF/2009/428), and resulted in an award-winning monograph (War and the City – Bloomsbury 2019), severalsols- and co-authored journal articles, and unnerous invited talks.

Urban geographies of counter-terrorism and radicalization in cities

In 2013, I published a co-authored monograph (The Radicals' Gity – Routledge) on the role of planning and the urban built environment in publical and religious radicalisation, based on ESRC-funded research (ESRC RES-181-25-0028). Recently, I have worked on issues of recilience and the humanities' tole in it as Co-I of an AHRC networking grant (AHHRO04331/I), and on the cognate area of counter-terrorism measures and their everyday and felt esperience in urban Europe, I am Principal Investigator (PI) of the project "Atmospheres of toutlet/terrorism in European cities" (2021- 2023) funded by a Open Research Area (ORA)grant (ESV/0135387I) funded by a ESRC (USLA)AR (France) and DFG (Germany).
